Independent Accountants' Report on State Compliance and on Internal Control over Compliance for State Compliance Purposes

#### Compliance

As Special Assistant Auditors for the Auditor General, we have examined the University of Illinois' compliance with the requirements listed below, as more fully described in the Audit Guide for Financial Audits and Compliance Attestation Engagements of Illinois State Agencies (Audit Guide) as adopted by the Auditor General, during the year ended June 30, 2012. The management of the University of Illinois (the University) is responsible for compliance with these requirements. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the University's compliance based on our examination.

- A. The University has obligated, expended, received, and used public funds of the State in accordance with the purpose for which such funds have been appropriated or otherwise authorized by law.
- B. The University has obligated, expended, received, and used public funds of the State in accordance with any limitations, restrictions, conditions or mandatory directions imposed by law upon such obligation, expenditure, receipt or use.
- C. The University has complied, in all material respects, with applicable laws and regulations, including the State uniform accounting system, in its financial and fiscal operations.
- D. State revenues and receipts collected by the University are in accordance with applicable laws and regulations and the accounting and recordkeeping of such revenues and receipts is fair, accurate and in accordance with law.
- E. Money or negotiable securities or similar assets handled by the University on behalf of the State or held in trust by the University have been properly and legally administered and the accounting and recordkeeping relating thereto is proper, accurate, and in accordance with law.

We conducted our examination in accordance with attestation standards established by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants; the standards applicable to attestation engagements contained in *Government Auditing Standards* issued by the Comptroller General of the United States; the Illinois State Auditing Act (Act); and the Audit Guide as adopted by the Auditor General pursuant to the Act; and, accordingly, included examining, on a test basis, evidence about the University's compliance with those requirements listed in the first paragraph of this report and performing such other procedures as we considered necessary in the circumstances. We believe that our examination provides a reasonable basis for our opinion. Our examination does not provide a legal determination on the University's compliance with specified requirements.

In our opinion, the University of Illinois complied, in all material respects, with the compliance requirements listed in the first paragraph of this report during the year ended June 30, 2012. However, the results of our procedures disclosed instances of noncompliance with the requirements, which are required to be reported in accordance with criteria established by the Audit Guide, issued by the Illinois Office of the Auditor General and which are described in the accompanying schedule of findings and questioned costs as findings 12-01, 12-02, and 12-17 through 12-30. As required by the Audit Guide, immaterial findings relating to instances of noncompliance excluded from this report have been reported in a separate letter to your office.

# **Internal Control**

Management of the University is responsible for establishing and maintaining effective internal control over compliance with the requirements listed in the first paragraph of this report. In planning and performing our examination, we considered the University's internal control over compliance with the requirements listed in the first paragraph of this report as a basis for designing our examination procedures for the purpose of expressing our opinion on compliance and to test and report on internal control over compliance in accordance with the Audit Guide issued by the Illinois Office of the Auditor General, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the University's internal control over compliance. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of the University's internal control over compliance.

A deficiency in an entity's internal control over compliance exists when the design or operation of a control over compliance does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct, noncompliance with the requirements listed in the first paragraph of this report on a timely basis. A material weakness in an entity's internal control over compliance is a deficiency, or combination of deficiencies, in internal control over compliance, such that there is a reasonable possibility that material noncompliance with a requirement listed in the first paragraph of this report will not be prevented, or detected and corrected, on a timely basis.

Our consideration of internal control over compliance was for the limited purpose described in the first paragraph of this section and was not designed to identify all deficiencies in internal control over compliance that might be deficiencies, significant deficiencies, or material weaknesses. We did not identify any deficiencies in internal control over compliance that we consider to be material weaknesses, as defined above. However, we identified certain deficiencies in internal control over compliance that we considered to be significant deficiencies as described in the accompanying schedule of findings and questioned costs as items finding 12-01, 12-02, and 12-17 through 12-25. A significant deficiencies, in internal control over compliance is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control over compliance that is less severe than a material weakness in internal control over compliance, yet important enough to merit attention by those charged with governance.

Additionally, the results of our procedures disclosed other matters involving internal control over compliance, which are required to be reported in accordance with criteria established by the Audit Guide

issued by the Illinois Office of the Auditor General and which are described in the accompanying schedule of findings and questioned costs as items 12-26 through 12-30.

As required by the Audit Guide, immaterial findings excluded from this report have been reported in a separate letter to your office.

The University's responses to the findings identified in our examination are described in the accompanying schedule of findings and questioned costs. We did not examine the University's responses and, accordingly, we express no opinion on the responses.

This report is intended solely for the information and use of the Illinois Auditor General, the Illinois General Assembly, the Illinois Legislative Audit Commission, the Governor of the State of Illinois, University management, the Board of Trustees of the University, others within the University, and federal awarding agencies and pass-through entities and is not intended to be and should not be used by anyone other than these specified parties.

# Independent Auditors' Report on Internal Control over Financial Reporting and on Compliance and Other Matters Based on an Audit of Financial Statements Performed in Accordance with *Government Auditing Standards*

The Honorable William G. Holland Auditor General of the State of Illinois and The Board of Trustees University of Illinois:

As Special Assistant Auditors for the Auditor General of the State of Illinois, we have audited the financial statements of the business-type activities and the aggregate discretely presented component units of the University of Illinois (the University), a component unit of the State of Illinois, as of and for the year ended June 30, 2012, which collectively comprise the University of Illinois basic financial statements and have issued our report thereon dated December 17, 2012. Our report was modified to reference other auditors and that our opinion, insofar as it relates to the discretely presented component units, is based solely on the opinions of other auditors. Our report was also modified to include reference to the adoption of a new accounting pronouncement. We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in Government Auditing Standards, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States. Other auditors audited the financial statements of the University of Illinois Foundation (a discretely presented component unit) in accordance with *Government Auditing Standards*, as described in our report on the University's financial statements. This report does not include the results of the other auditors' testing of internal control over financial reporting or compliance and other matters that are reported on separately by those auditors. The financial statements of The University of Illinois Alumni Association, Wolcott, Wood, and Taylor, Inc., Prairieland Energy, Inc., Illinois Ventures, LLC, The University of Illinois Research Park, LLC, and UI Singapore Research, LLC (all discretely presented component units) were not audited in accordance with Government Auditing Standards.

# **Internal Control over Financial Reporting**

Management of the University is responsible for establishing and maintaining effective internal control over financial reporting. In planning and performing our audit, we considered the University's internal control over financial reporting as a basis for designing our auditing procedures for the purpose of expressing our opinions on the financial statements, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the University's internal control over financial control over financial reporting. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of the University's internal control over financial reporting.

A deficiency in internal control over financial reporting exists when the design or operation of a control does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct misstatements on a timely basis. A material weakness is a deficiency, or combination of deficiencies, in internal control over financial reporting, such that there is a reasonable possibility that a material misstatement of the entity's financial statements will not be prevented, or detected and corrected on a timely basis. Our consideration of internal control over financial reporting was for the limited purpose described in the first paragraph of this section and was not designed to identify all deficiencies, in internal control over financial reporting that might be deficiencies, significant deficiencies, or material weaknesses. We did not identify any deficiencies in internal control over financial reporting that we consider to be material weaknesses, as defined above. However, we identified certain deficiencies in internal control over financial reporting that are described in the accompanying schedule of findings and responses as finding numbers 12-01 and 12-02. A significant deficiency is a deficiency, or combination of deficiencies, in internal control over financial reporting that is less severe than a material weakness, yet important enough to merit attention by those charged with governance.

#### **Compliance and Other Matters**

As part of obtaining reasonable assurance about whether the University's financial statements are free of material misstatement, we performed tests of its compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts, and grant agreements, noncompliance with which could have a direct and material effect on the determination of financial statement amounts. However, providing an opinion on compliance with those provisions was not an objective of our audit, and accordingly, we do not express such an opinion. The results of our tests disclosed no instances of noncompliance or other matters that are required to be reported under *Government Auditing Standards*.

The University's responses to the findings identified in our audit are described in the accompanying schedule of findings and responses. We did not audit the University's responses and, accordingly, we express no opinion on them.

This report is intended solely for the information and use of the Illinois Auditor General, the Illinois General Assembly, the Illinois Legislative Audit Commission, the Illinois Governor, University management, the Board of Trustees of the University of Illinois, others within the University, and federal awarding agencies and pass-through entities and is not intended to be and should not be used by anyone other than these specified parties.

# Independent Auditors' Report on Compliance with Requirements That Could Have a Direct and Material Effect on Each Major Program, on Internal Control over Compliance, and on the Schedule of Expenditures of Federal Awards in Accordance with OMB Circular A-133

# Compliance

We have audited the compliance of the University of Illinois (the University) with the types of compliance requirements described in the US Office of Management and Budget (OMB) *Circular A-133 Compliance Supplement* (the Compliance Supplement) that could have a direct and material effect on each of the University's major federal programs for the year ended June 30, 2012, except the requirements discussed in the third paragraph of this report. The University's major federal programs are identified in the summary of auditors' results section of the accompanying schedule of findings and questioned costs. Compliance with the requirements of laws, regulations, contracts, and grants applicable to each of its major federal programs is the responsibility of the University's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the University's compliance based on our audit.

The University's financial statements include the operations of these entities determined to be component units of the University for financial statement purposes. Our audit, described below, did not include the operations of the University's component units because they are audited by other auditors and/or they do not expand federal funds.

We did not audit the University's compliance with the requirements governing the repayments special test and provision compliance requirement in accordance with the requirements of the Student Financial Assistance Cluster: Federal Perkins Loan program as described in the Compliance Supplement. Those requirements govern functions performed by Affiliated Computer Services, Inc. (ACS). Since we did not apply auditing procedures to satisfy ourselves as to compliance with those requirements, the scope of work was not sufficient to enable us to express, and we do not express, an opinion on compliance with those requirements. ACS' compliance with the requirements governing the functions that it performs for the University for the year ended June 30, 2012 was examined by the accountants for the servicer in accordance with the U.S. Department of Education's Audit Guide, *Audits of Federal Student Financial Assistance Programs at Participating Institutions and Institution Servicers*. Our report does not include the results of the accountants' examination of ACS' compliance with such requirements.

We conducted our audit of compliance in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America; the standards applicable to financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards*, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States; and OMB Circular A-133, *Audits of States, Local* 

*Governments, and Non-Profit Organizations.* Those standards and OMB Circular A-133 require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether noncompliance with the types of compliance requirements referred to above that could have a direct and material effect on a major federal program occurred. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence about the University's compliance with those requirements and performing such other procedures as we considered necessary in the circumstances. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion. Our audit does not provide a legal determination on the University's compliance with those requirements.

In our opinion, the University complied, in all material respects, with the compliance requirements referred to in the paragraph above that could have a direct and material effect on each of its major federal programs for the year ended June 30, 2012. However, the results of our auditing procedures disclosed instances of noncompliance with those requirements, which are required to be reported in accordance with OMB Circular A-133 and which are described in the accompanying schedule of findings and questioned costs as findings 12-03 through 12-13.

# **Internal Control over Compliance**

The management of the University is responsible for establishing and maintaining effective internal control over compliance with requirements of laws, regulations, contracts, and grants applicable to federal programs. In planning and performing our audit, we considered the University's internal control over compliance with requirements that could have a direct and material effect on a major federal program in order to determine the auditing procedures for the purpose of expressing our opinion on compliance and to test and report on internal control over compliance in accordance with OMB Circular A-133, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of internal control over compliance.

Requirements governing the repayments special test and provision compliance requirement in the Student Financial Assistance Cluster: Federal Perkins Loan program as described in the Compliance Supplement are performed by ACS. Internal control over compliance related to such functions for the year ended June 30, 2012 was reported on by accountants for the servicer in accordance with the U.S. Department of Education's Audit Guide, *Audits of Federal Student Financial Assistance Programs at Participating Institutions and Institution Servicers*. Our report does not include the results of the accountants' for the servicer testing of ACS' internal control over compliance related to such functions.

Our consideration of internal control over compliance was for the limited purpose described in the first paragraph of this section and would not necessarily identify all deficiencies in the entity's internal control over compliance that might be significant deficiencies or material weaknesses and therefore, there can be no assurance that all deficiencies, significant deficiencies, or material weaknesses have been identified. However, as discussed below, we identified certain deficiencies in internal control over compliance that we consider to be material weaknesses and other deficiencies that we consider to be significant deficiencies.

A deficiency in internal control over compliance exists when the design or operation of a control does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct, noncompliance with a type of compliance requirement of a federal program on a timely basis. A material weakness in internal control over compliance is a deficiency, or combination of deficiencies, in internal control over compliance such that there is a reasonable possibility that material noncompliance with a type of compliance requirement of a federal program will not be prevented, or detected and corrected on a timely basis. We consider the deficiencies in internal control over compliance described in the accompanying schedule of findings and questioned costs as items 12-03 through 12-10 to be material weaknesses.

A significant deficiency in internal control over compliance is a deficiency, or combination of deficiencies in internal control over compliance with a type of compliance requirement of a federal program, that is less severe than a material weakness in internal control over compliance yet important enough to merit attention by those

charged with governance. We consider the deficiencies in internal control over compliance described in the accompanying schedule of findings and questioned costs as items 12-11 through 12-16 to be significant deficiencies.

# Schedule of Expenditures of Federal Awards

We have audited the financial statements of the business-type activities and the aggregate discretely presented component units of the University of Illinois, a component unit of the State of Illinois, as of and for the year ended June 30, 2012 and have issued our report thereon dated December 17, 2012. Our report was modified to include a reference to other auditors. Our audit was performed for the purpose of forming opinions on the financial statements that collectively comprise the University of Illinois' basic financial statements. We have not performed any procedures with respect to the audited financial statements subsequent to December 17, 2012. The accompanying schedule of expenditures of federal awards is presented for purposes of additional analysis as required by OMB Circular A-133 and is not a required part of the basic financial statements. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the basic financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. In our opinion, the schedule of expenditures of federal awards is fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the basic financial statements taken as a whole.

The University's responses to the findings identified in our audit are described in the accompanying schedule of findings and questioned costs. We did not audit the University's responses, and accordingly, we express no opinion on the responses.

This report is intended solely for the information and use of the Illinois Auditor General, the Illinois General Assembly, the Illinois Legislative Audit Commission, the Governor of the State of Illinois, University management, the Board of Trustees of the University, others within the University, and federal awarding agencies and pass-through entities and is not intended to be and should not be used by anyone other than these specified parties.

#### Finding 12-01 – Inadequate Year End Payables and Receivable Accruals Process

The University has not established adequate internal controls over accurately identifying and recording period end accounts payable and accounts receivable transactions for financial reporting purposes.

During our audit, we noted the University's year end accounts payable procedures include specifically reviewing cash disbursements made subsequent to year end through the fourth week in October to determine to which accounting period the related expense transactions pertained. We further noted the University's year end accounts payable procedures also include calculating and recording an estimate of unrecorded liabilities largely based on historical disbursement activity. In addition, the University performs reviews over cash disbursements subsequent to year end to track and monitor the actual level of unrecorded liabilities. The actual level of unrecorded liabilities is then compared to the estimate originally recorded for financial reporting purposes. The University's year end accounts receivable procedures require units to identify and report any accounts receivable. In relation to our testwork on revenue transactions, we reviewed 34 revenue transactions recorded during the fiscal year (totaling \$6,460,461). In relation to our testwork on expense transactions, we reviewed 251 expense transactions recorded during the fiscal year (totaling \$6,284,259). Additionally, we separately reviewed 214 journal entry transactions recorded during the fiscal year (totaling \$1,817,665,671). Further, we reviewed 64 capital asset additions recorded during the fiscal year (totaling \$168,542,428). During our review of these transactions we noted the following items were not recorded in the proper accounting period:

- One capital asset addition transaction (totaling \$701,209) was improperly over-accrued by \$604,086 as of June 30, 2012 because of an inaccurate percentage of completion estimate. Upon further review, the University identified a total of 41 capital additions that were over-accrued by \$4,713,029 from the inaccurate percentage of completion estimate.
- Three supplies and services expense transactions (totaling \$12,222) which pertained to fiscal year 2011 but were recognized as expense in fiscal year 2012.
- One fellowship expense transaction (totaling \$4,176) which pertained to fiscal year 2011 but was recognized as expense in fiscal year 2012.
- Two scholarship expense transactions (totaling \$1,500) which pertained to fiscal year 2011 but were recognized as expense in fiscal year 2012.
- Six travel expense transactions (totaling \$ 63,203) which pertained to fiscal year 2011 but were recognized as expense in fiscal year 2012.
- One contractual service expense transaction (totaling \$5,144) which pertained to fiscal year 2011 but was recognized as expense in fiscal year 2012.
- Two supplies and services expense transactions (totaling \$7,522) which pertained to fiscal year 2012 but were recognized as expense in fiscal year 2013.
- Two scholarship expense transactions (totaling \$1,373) which pertained to fiscal year 2012 but were recognized as expense in fiscal year 2013.
- Two travel expense transactions (totaling \$9,306) which pertained to fiscal year 2013 but were recognized as expense in fiscal year 2012.
- One telecommunication expense transaction (totaling \$12,917) which pertained to fiscal year 2013 but was recognized as expense in fiscal year 2012.

- Two contractual service expense transactions (totaling \$59,267) which pertained to fiscal year 2013 but were recognized as expense in fiscal year 2012.
- One educational activity revenue transaction for a summer youth music camp (totaling \$28,001) which pertained to fiscal year 2012 but was recognized as revenue in fiscal year 2013.

Generally accepted accounting principles require transactions to be reported in the period they are incurred. Additionally, the Fiscal Control and Internal Auditing Act (Illinois Compiled Statutes Chapter 30 Section 10/3001), requires the University to establish and maintain a system, or systems, of internal fiscal and administrative controls, which shall provide assurance that: (1) resources are utilized efficiently, effectively, and in compliance with applicable law; (2) obligations and costs are in compliance with applicable law; (3) funds, property, and other assets and resources are safeguarded against waste, loss, unauthorized use, and misappropriation; (4) revenues, expenditures, and transfers of assets, resources, or funds applicable to operations are properly recorded and accounted for to permit the preparation of accounts and reliable financial and statistical reports and to maintain accountability over the State's resources; and (5) funds held outside the State Treasury are managed, used, and obtained in strict accordance with the terms of their enabling authorities and that no unauthorized funds exist. The University's system of internal controls should include procedures to accurately assess whether expenditures and revenues are reported in the appropriate period.

In discussing these conditions with University personnel, they stated that the units associated with the exceptions did not adequately understand/follow the procedures to record the transactions in the proper period. While the University believes it has processes in place to prevent material misstatements in the financial statements, the highly decentralized business environment with hundreds of units and large volumes of transactions, does present challenges to catching all errors.

Failure to accurately record expense and revenue transactions in the correct accounting period may result in the misstatement of the University's financial statements. (Finding Code 12-01, 11-01, 10-03, 09-03)

#### **Recommendation:**

We recommend the University review its current process to assess the completeness of its expense and revenue accruals at year end and consider changes necessary to ensure all period end accounts payable and accounts receivables are accurately identified and recorded.

# **University Response:**

Accepted. The University has already implemented significant process enhancements in this area. Through analysis of the exceptions identified in the audit, the University will work to develop and implement corrective actions to further improve the year-end processes in this area.

#### Finding 12-02 – Inadequate Controls over University Procurement Card Transactions

The University has not established adequate internal control over procurement transactions.

The University operates a procurement card program which allows individuals throughout the University to make smaller purchases (defined as less than \$4,999) on a credit card which is directly reimbursed by the University on a monthly basis. The University's policies require employees assigned a procurement card to complete training on policies and procedures, pass a test, and sign an agreement stipulating they will use the card in accordance with University policy. This agreement is also required to be authorized by the individual's supervisor or the department head. The University's policies require transactions incurred on the procurement card to be approved in the University's procurement card system by the individual cardholder and an assigned reviewer. Although the University has established policies and procedures for issuing procurement cards, incurring and paying for expenditures with procurement cards, and reviewing and approving of procurement card transactions, we noted the University has not implemented procedures to identify duplicate charges or to reconcile procurement card transactions with travel reimbursement forms. As a result, erroneous or duplicate charges may be paid and recorded by the University without any further detective controls to identify them. We also identified the following exceptions in our testwork over 40 procurement card transactions totaling \$118,858:

- One transaction (totaling \$4,624) was for charges prohibited by the University's procurement card policies.
- Two transactions (totaling \$12,340) were paid in two or more installments, circumventing the card holder's single transaction limit of \$4,999.
- One transaction (totaling \$1,065) was recorded in the incorrect fiscal year.
- Three transactions (totaling \$7,398) were purchases of equipment that were not tagged in accordance with University's policies and procedures.

The University has approximately 5,241 active procurement cards and the procurement card expenditures paid for the year ended June 30, 2012 totaled \$87,939,495.

The Fiscal Control and Internal Auditing Act (Illinois Compiled Statutes Chapter 30 Section 10/3001), requires the University to establish and maintain a system, or systems, of internal fiscal and administrative controls, which shall provide assurance that: (1) resources are utilized efficiently, effectively, and in compliance with applicable law; (2) obligations and costs are in compliance with applicable law; (3) funds, property, and other assets and resources are safeguarded against waste, loss, unauthorized use, and misappropriation; (4) revenues, expenditures, and transfers of assets, resources, or funds applicable to operations are properly recorded and accounted for to permit the preparation of accounts and reliable financial and statistical reports and to maintain accountability over the State's resources; and (5) funds held outside the State Treasury are managed, used, and obtained in strict accordance with the terms of their enabling authorities and that no unauthorized funds exist. The University's system of internal controls should include procedures to ensure procurement card transactions are in accordance with University policies and procedures and supporting documentation for each transaction is maintained.

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In discussing these conditions with University personnel, they stated that in fiscal 2012 the University was still in the process of implementing its new Travel and Expense Management System, which will provide controls, in addition to those already in place, to further eliminate the possibility of duplicate transactions with regard to travel reimbursements. The bulleted exceptions noted in this finding were a result of human error; specifically, the failure of certain employees to comply with University policy that is clearly stated and disseminated to all through required training.

Failure to properly review and approve procurement card transactions could result in erroneous or fraudulent transactions being recorded in the general ledger system. (Finding Code 12-02, 11-03, 10-02, 09-02, and 08-03)

#### **Recommendation:**

We recommend the University review its current process for reviewing and approving procurement card transactions and consider any changes necessary to ensure charges are made in accordance with University policies and procedures. We also recommend the University implement procedures to identify duplicate transactions and to reconcile procurement card transactions to travel reimbursement forms.

#### **University Response:**

Accepted. The University recognizes that with approximately 5,200 active procurement cards, erroneous charges can and do occur. The University employs careful oversight and review to ensure these errors are minimal, and it takes immediate action when errors are discovered. The University will continue to be proactive in improving controls over the P-Card system and will continue to provide training and review of policies and requirements for all cardholders. Training to units on proper procedures for tagging of equipment will also be continued

# Finding 12-03 Improper Eligibility Determinations

The University did not perform eligibility determinations for beneficiaries of the Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant (MCH Block Grant) program in accordance with program regulations.

MCH Block Grant funds are used to provide care to special needs children who meet a variety of program eligibility requirements which include medical, financial, and other general criteria. During our testwork of 60 beneficiary payments (totaling \$528,347) claimed under the MCH program, we noted the following:

- Financial eligibility was improperly determined by using only the beneficiary's income and a family size of one for two beneficiaries (with sampled payments of \$10,534). Since these beneficiaries are considered dependents of their parents, the financial eligibility determination should have considered parental income and other family members. As a result of these exceptions in our testing, the University reperformed the eligibility determinations for these individuals and noted the beneficiaries were eligible for the benefits provided.
- Financial eligibility was improperly determined by including Supplemental Social Security Income in the financial resources for one beneficiary (with a sampled payment of \$667). Program regulations stipulate that Supplemental Social Security Income should be excluded from financial resources. As a result of these exceptions in our testing, the University reperformed the eligibility determinations for this individual and noted the beneficiary was eligible for the benefits provided.

According to 89 Illinois Administrative Code, Chapter X, Section 1200.50, financial assistance is provided to meet medical care expenses for children who meet the criteria of the State's financial need determination. Additionally, OMB Circular A-110, *Uniform Administrative Requirements for Grant and Agreements with Institutions of Higher Education, Hospitals, and Other Non-Profit Organizations*, requires nonfederal entities receiving federal awards establish and maintain internal control designed to reasonably ensure compliance with federal laws, regulations, and program compliance requirements. Effective internal control should include procedures to ensure eligibility determinations are properly performed in accordance with program regulations.

In discussing these conditions with University officials, they stated these conditions were the result of data entry errors.

Failure to perform eligibility determinations in accordance with program regulations may result in ineligible beneficiaries receiving services for which they are not eligible. (Finding Code 12-03, 11-06)

# **Recommendation:**

We recommend the University review its current procedures for performing eligibility determinations in accordance with program regulations and implement any changes necessary to ensure eligibility determinations are performed in accordance with program regulations.

# **University Response:**

Accepted. The University has adequate procedures for performing eligibility determinations in accordance with program regulations. Eligibility for both clients was correct in spite of the data entry errors. Both clients received appropriate benefits based on program limitations.

#### Finding 12-04 Inadequate Procedures for Closing Federal Projects

The University does not have adequate procedures in place to ensure federal projects are closed in a timely manner.

The University administers thousands of individual federal projects from several federal agencies and passthrough entities which have varying project periods. The University has formally documented policies and procedures for closing out federally funded projects which generally require projects to be closed within 90 days after the project end date. Procedures have been established to send a notice of terminating accounts to the principal investigator or program coordinator 90 days prior to the project end date. The notice provides information about the process for closing projects and includes an information request for any extensions granted and other project information necessary to complete the project close out. Personnel in the Grants and Contracts Office are responsible for ensuring the University has met its obligations under the project, closing the general ledger accounts, and returning any unexpended grant funds to the federal agency or pass-through entity.

During our review of the schedule of expenditures of federal awards for the year ended June 30, 2012, we noted expenditures (or negative expenditures) were reported for several projects with end dates prior to June 30, 2010. Specifically, we noted the following:

Upon review of a sample of 40 transactions recorded in projects with end dates prior to June 30, 2010, we noted the vast majority of the transactions selected were to transfer expenditures to the correct project accounts. The underlying transactions being transferred had been erroneously recorded to an incorrect project several years prior to the date of the transfer. Accordingly, the periodic financial reports previously submitted for several of the University's federally funded projects inaccurately included or excluded project expenditures which were later transferred between projects.

OMB Circular A-110, Uniform Administrative Requirements for Grant and Agreements with Institutions of Higher Education, Hospitals, and Other Non-Profit Organizations (OMB Circular A-110) requires accurate, current, and complete disclosure of the financial results of each federally-sponsored project or program in accordance with the applicable reporting criteria. OMB Circular A-110 also requires nonfederal entities receiving federal awards establish and maintain internal control designed to reasonably ensure compliance with federal laws, regulations, and program compliance requirements. Effective internal controls should include procedures to ensure expenditures (including cost transfers) are allowable in accordance with federal regulations.

In discussing these conditions with University officials, they stated there a variety of reasons for delays in grant close-outs.

Failure to close projects and process necessary cost transfers in a timely manner may result in inaccurate periodic financial reports and disallowances of costs. (Finding Code 12-04, 11-07, 10-11, 09-13)

#### **Recommendation:**

We recommend the University implement procedures to monitor the timeliness of project close outs. Additionally, the University should review its current processes to identify any additional procedures necessary to reduce the number of late cost transfers being processed upon the close out of its federal projects.

#### **University Response:**

Accepted. While the University believes adequate controls are in place, and the majority of awards are closed in a timely manner, it will continue to monitor the timeliness of closeouts. As noted in the finding above, there are a variety of reasons for delays in grant close-outs. There are instances of late award close-out. The causes of a late close-out vary depending on the award and the situation. Incremental funding on multi-year awards may be delayed, causing valid and allowable expenditures to post during the wait period. Difficulties in collecting delinquent accounts receivable balances or completion of project deliverables have also contributed to delays in the closeout of awards.

Of the 135 projects listed, 113 were closed (termed) in FY12.

The University continues to make progress in the close out process as evidenced by the decrease in open awards in the table below:

Finding 12-05 Inadequate Supporting Documentation for Cost Transfers

The University does not adequately document cost transfers.

The University has formal policies and procedures which outline the documentation required to support cost transfers and a standard form has been developed to assist the University in collecting supporting documentation for each cost transfer. The standard form provides a series of potential reasons that a cost transfer may be required and prompts the preparer to other sections of the form to provide additional supporting documentation as prescribed by University policy. The form is required to be certified by the principal investigator or another responsible official and must be reviewed and approved by the Grants and Contracts Office.

During our testwork over 220 cost transfers recorded during the year ended June 30, 2012, we were initially provided brief journal entry descriptions as the supporting documentation for each of the cost transfers selected. The journal entry descriptions consisted of a few sentences which generally stated an error had occurred in the original entry and that a transfer was required. These descriptions did not provide sufficient information to allow an independent party to understand the reason the cost transfer was required. Upon further investigation and inquiry, the University was able to provide other support which better described the reasons for some of the cost transfers tested. However, the standard cost transfer form was not completed in accordance with University policy for a majority of the transfers tested. Upon further inquiry, we noted the majority of these transfers were initiated by the Grants and Contracts Office in closing out projects and the standard cost transfer forms were not completed for any cost transfers prepared by the Grants and Contracts Office.

OMB Circular A-21, *Cost Principles for Higher Education Institutions*, establishes principles and standards for determining costs for federal awards carried out through grants, cost reimbursements contracts, and other agreements with higher education institutions. To be allowable under federal awards, costs must meet certain general criteria. Those criteria, among other things, require that the expenditures must be allocable, reasonable, and supported by adequate documentation. OMB Circular A-110, *Uniform Administrative Requirements for Grant and Agreements with Institutions of Higher Education, Hospitals, and Other Non-Profit Organizations*

(OMB Circular A-110) requires nonfederal entities receiving federal awards establish and maintain internal control designed to reasonably ensure compliance with federal laws, regulations, and program compliance requirements. Effective internal controls should include procedures to ensure expenditures (including cost transfers) are adequately documented in accordance with federal regulations and University policy.

In discussing these conditions with University officials, they stated cost transfers are adequately documented and supported in accordance with University policy that meets the requirements of OMB Circular A-21 and OMB Circular A-110.

Failure to adequately document cost transfers may result in unallowable costs being charged to federal programs. (Finding Code 12-05, 11-08, 10-12, 09-14)

#### **Recommendation:**

We recommend the University implement procedures to ensure costs transfers are adequately documented and supported in accordance with University policy.

#### **University Response:**

Not Accepted. As noted in previous years, the Banner FOATEXT journal entry descriptions are not intended for independent parties. They are specifically written as a guide or map to where additional information may be found.

The University provided appropriate support for each of the cost transfers selected. During fieldwork and based on their sample selection, the Firm goes into the Banner Accounting System to view cost transfer information. It is not provided by the University in this initial step.

The information in the Banner FOATEXT should not be considered as journal entry descriptions as noted in the finding. While it is accurately stated by the Firm that the information in the form consists of a few sentences generally stating an error had occurred in the original entry and that a transfer was required, it also contains contact information. According to University policy, the FOATEXT documentation provides information to assist the University user, primarily the Grants and Contracts Office (GCO), in determining allowability and gives guidance for obtaining more information. The FOATEXT forms were completed with the information required by the policy.

When requested by the auditors to provide supporting documentation, the University staff use the information as intended and provide other support as noted in the finding. This shows that the description is functioning as intended, and resulted in the Firm being provided with other support they believe better describes the reason for the cost transfers. Banner capacity for the FOATEXT form does not allow for in depth description or attachments.

In accordance with University policy, GC-81 forms (noted above as the standard cost transfer form) are not required for transfer of charges between active funds for the same Banner grant code or a removal of an overdraft to a non-sponsored project fund. Additionally, a completed GC-81 form is not required for administrative transactions performed by GCO and other University Administration departments. Federal Agriculture Funds do

not complete the form as they do not fall under the policy for completion. No specific exceptions were noted for GC-81s.

# Auditors' Response:

As discussed in the finding above, the nature and reason for the cost transfer was not adequately documented based upon our review of documentation provided by the University and had to be supplemented through inquiry of University personnel and other documentation generated in response to our questions. We understand University policy to require a specific form to be completed to support cost transfers; however, several of the cost transfers were not supported with the standard cost transfer form. We believe the University should implement procedures to ensure costs transfers are adequately documented and supported in accordance with University policy and federal regulations.

# Finding 12-06 Inadequate Process for Monitoring Cost Share Requirement

The University does not have an adequate process in place to ensure expenditures used to meet the cost sharing requirement of the Research and Development Cluster are allowable.

The University is required to meet cost share requirements for numerous awards in the Research and Development Cluster. The expenditures used to meet the cost share requirement are funded by multiple sources including contributed effort by University personnel, University funded contractual services, and costs funded by subrecipients of the University. During our testwork over 40 cost share expenditures, we noted 30 subrecipient expenditures that were not supported by detailed expenditure information. Upon further review, we noted the University had received signed letters certifying the expenditures were incurred from each subrecipient; however, the information provided by the subrecipient was not sufficient to allow the University to determine whether the

costs meet allowable cost criteria, including whether the expenditures are adequately supported and documented by the subrecipient.

OMB Circular A-110, Uniform Administrative Requirements for Grant and Agreements with Institutions of Higher Education, Hospitals, and Other Non-Profit Organizations, states expenditures claimed as cost share must be verifiable from the recipient's records, allowable under the applicable cost principles, and must not be paid by the Federal Government under another award. Additionally, OMB Circular A-110 requires nonfederal entities receiving federal awards establish and maintain internal control designed to reasonably ensure compliance with federal laws, regulations, and program compliance requirements. Effective internal controls should include procedures to ensure cost share requirements are attained in accordance with program requirements.

In discussing these conditions with University officials, they stated the management decision letter received in fiscal year 2013 clarified the changes to be made to the University's process and procedures.

Failure to adequately document and monitor cost share expenditures may result in the University using unallowable costs to meet its cost share requirement. (Finding Code 12-06, 11-09)

## **Recommendation:**

We recommend the University implement monitoring procedures to ensure cost share expenditures reported by its subrecipients are allowable.

## **University Response:**

Accepted. In response to the Management Decision Letter from the Office of Naval Research (ONR), the Urbana Campus has implemented procedures to monitor cost sharing claimed by subrecipients are allowable prior the final close of the subaward. The University's plan of action was provided to the Firm by ONR on November 27, 2012.

Finding 12-07 Improper Reporting of Amounts in Financial Status Reports

The University did not accurately report information in its financial status reports in accordance with the applicable reporting requirements.

The University is required to prepare periodic financial status (SF-269) reports and federal financial (SF-425) reports for awards received directly from federal agencies. The SF-269 reports and SF-425 reports, which may be prepared on the cash or accrual basis of accounting, include information on program expenditures, unliquidated obligations, and indirect expenses charged to the grant.

OMB Circular A-110, Uniform Administrative Requirements for Grant and Agreements with Institutions of Higher Education, Hospitals, and Other Non-Profit Organizations (OMB Circular A-110) and the grant agreements, contracts, and other award documents for the major programs identified above, require the University to prepare periodic Financial Status Reports (SF-269 (OMB No. 0348-0039) and Federal Financial Reports (SF-425 (OMB No. 0348-0061). The instructions for the reports define the cash basis amount for *outlays* as the sum of actual cash disbursements for the direct costs of goods and services, the amount of indirect expense charged, the value of in-kind contributions applied, and the amount of cash advances and payments made to subrecipients and for *unliquidated obligations* as obligations incurred, but not yet paid. OMB Circular A-110 also requires nonfederal entities receiving federal awards establish and maintain internal control designed to reasonably ensure compliance with federal laws, regulations, and program compliance requirements. Effective internal controls should include procedures to ensure financial status reports are complete, accurate, and prepared using the accurate basis of accounting.

In discussing these conditions with University officials, they stated the errors were a result of clerical errors.

Failure to prepare reports in accordance with reporting requirements inhibits the ability of the federal agencies to properly monitor and evaluate the performance of the programs. (Finding Code 12-07, 11-11, 10-15, 09-15)

## **Recommendation:**

We recommend the University implement procedures to ensure the information reported in its financial status reports are complete, accurate, and on the appropriate basis of accounting.

The Urbana campus agrees that the Federal Share of Unliquidated Obligations on one SF-425 was reported in error and another SF-425 incorrectly understated reported expenditures.

For the Cooperative Extension Services, the University agrees that three reports for the September 30, 2011, reporting period incorrectly categorized unliquidated obligations in error on three SF-425 reports. However, the Total Federal Share (line 10g) was reported correctly on each report. Only the split between expenditures (line 10e) and unliquidated obligations (line 10f) were incorrectly categorized.

The University will continue to work with staff to ensure information reported on our financial reports is accurate.

## UIC Response - Accepted.

The Chicago campus agrees that one SF-425 and one quarterly report contained errors that were discovered and corrected in a subsequent reporting period for 2P01CA098262-6A1 and FA 7014-09-0003 respectively. We also agree that the SF-425 report for 2P50AT000155-11 reported slightly lower than actual expenditures at the end of the budget period. The University will continue to work with staff to ensure information reported on our financial reports is accurate.

Finding 12-08 Inaccurate Fringe Benefit Charges

The University did not properly charge fringe benefits to awards in the Research and Development Cluster program.

The University calculates fringe benefits (including retirement, health, life, dental, Medicare, (OASDI), workers compensation, and termination benefits) based on the gross payroll amount each pay cycle for eligible employees. The ledger account code to which an employee is assigned in the payroll system identifies whether employees are eligible for the various types of benefits. During our testwork of 80 fringe benefit charges for the Research and Development Cluster program, we noted Medicare benefits (of approximately \$69) were not charged for one R&D employee at the Chicago campus.

For the year ending June 30, 2012, total fringe benefits for the Research & Development Cluster program was \$48,394,016.

In discussing this condition with University officials, they stated a coding error was made at the time the appointment was established in the system.

Failure to properly code employees within the payroll system may result in unallowable costs being charged to federal programs. (Finding Code 12-08, 11-13)

## **Recommendation:**

We recommend the University implement procedures to ensure employees are properly coded in the payroll system and fringe benefits charges are properly charged to federal awards.

## **University Response:**

Accepted. The University will take the necessary corrective action to address the recommendation in this finding.

Finding 12-09 Inadequate Process for Limiting Indirect Costs on DOD Awards

The University does not have an adequate process in place to ensure indirect costs charged to Department of Defense (DOD) awards in the Research and Development Cluster are limited in accordance with DOD regulations.

During our testwork over eight (six from the Urbana Campus and two from the Chicago Campus) Department of Defense (DOD) awards that closed during the year ended June 30, 2012, we noted indirect costs charged to two awards administered by the Chicago campus were in excess of 35%. Upon further investigation, we noted the indirect cost rates entered in the University's accounting system for these grants was the standard Facilities and Administration (F&A) rate. As a result, the indirect cost charges applied by the University's accounting system exceeded the amount allowable under DOD regulations by \$1,669 and \$133. We also noted the University did not consider whether an interest calculation was required to be performed for any funds advanced as a result of these excess reimbursements.

Per the Department of Defense's Appropriations Acts, Public Law 110-116, Division A, Section 8115, Public Law 110-329, Division C, Section 8109, and Public Law 111-118, Section 8101, notwithstanding any other provision of law, none of the funds made available in the Act may be used to pay negotiated indirect cost rates on a contract, grant, or cooperative agreement entered into by the Department of Defense and an entity in excess of 35 percent of the total cost of the contract, grant, or agreement provided, that this limitation shall apply only to contracts, grants, or cooperative agreements entered into after the date of the enactment of the Act using funds made available in the Act for fiscal year 2008 for basic research. ONR implementation guidance to the University advised that compliance should be tested at the end of the award when total costs are available.

OMB Circular A-21, *Cost Principles for Higher Education Institutions*, establishes principles and standards for determining costs for federal awards carried out through grants, cost reimbursements contracts, and other agreements with higher education institutions. To be allowable under federal awards, costs must meet certain general criteria. Those criteria, among other things, require that the expenditures must be allocable, reasonable, and supported by adequate documentation.

Additionally, OMB Circular A-110, Uniform Administrative Requirements for Grant and Agreements with Institutions of Higher Education, Hospitals, and Other Non-Profit Organizations, requires nonfederal entities

receiving federal awards establish and maintain internal control designed to reasonably ensure compliance with federal laws, regulations, and program compliance requirements. Effective internal controls should include procedures to ensure the appropriate indirect cost rate is applied to all awards subject to the limitation at the end of the award.

In discussing these conditions with University officials, they stated that these instances were due to human error.

Failure to adequately limit the indirect costs charged to DOD awards as required by federal regulations results in advances of federal funds. (Finding Code 12-09, 11-15)

#### **Recommendation:**

We recommend the University implement procedures to ensure indirect costs charged to DOD awards are limited to 35% where required at the end of the award period.

#### **University Response:**

Accepted. The University has tools and procedures in place to monitor indirect costs limitations on DOD awards. Rounding errors caused two awards to assess indirect costs in excess of the 35% of the Facilities and Administration (F&A) limitation; however, the assessment was less than 36% for both.

The 35% limit on payments of indirect costs is not an indirect cost rate. Instead, it is a limit on the ratio of indirect costs to the total cost of an award. The appropriate F&A rate was entered into the accounting system for both awards.

Funds in excess of the 35% limitation were refunded to the Department of Defense.

## Finding 12-10 Failure to Obtain Suspension and Debarment Certifications from Vendors

The University did not obtain required certifications that certain vendors were not suspended or debarred from participation in federal assistance programs.

During our review of 92 contractual expenditures for the Research and Development Cluster, we noted two expenditures for which the University did not obtain a signed suspension and debarment certification from the vendor. Additionally, the University did not perform a verification check with the "Excluded Parties List System" (EPLS) maintained by the General Services Administration for the vendor.

Total contractual expenditures charged to the Research and Development during the year ended June 30, 2012 was \$210,391,561.

According to OMB Circular A-110, Uniform Administrative Requirements for Grant and Agreements with Institutions of Higher Education, Hospitals, and Other Non-Profit Organizations (OMB Circular A-110), non-federal entities are prohibited from contracting with or making subawards under covered transactions to parties that are suspended or debarred or whose principals are suspended or debarred. "Covered transactions" include those procurement contracts for goods and services awarded under a nonprocurement transaction (e.g., grant or cooperative agreement) that are expected to equal or exceed \$25,000 or meet certain other specified criteria. All nonprocurement transactions (i.e., subawards to subrecipients), irrespective of award amount, are considered covered transactions. When a non-federal entity enters into a covered transaction with an entity at a lower tier, the non-federal entity must verify that the entity is not suspended or debarred or otherwise excluded. This verification may be accomplished by checking the *Excluded Parties List System (EPLS)* maintained by the General Services Administration, collecting a certification from the entity, or adding a clause or condition to the covered transaction with that entity.

OMB Circular A-110 also requires nonfederal entities receiving federal awards establish and maintain internal control designed to reasonably ensure compliance with federal laws, regulations, and program compliance requirements. Effective internal controls should include procedures in place to ensure the required certifications for covered contracts and subawards are received, documented, and contracts not made with a debarred or suspended party.

In discussing these conditions with University officials, they stated they did not retain a copy of one certification and did not obtain a signed certification for the second exception.

Failure to obtain the required certifications or perform verification procedures with the EPLS could result in the payment of federal funds to vendors that are suspended or debarred from participation in federal assistance programs. (Finding Code 12-10, 11-17, 10-20, 09-16)

## **Recommendation:**

We recommend the University obtain certifications from vendors stating that their organization is not suspended, debarred, or otherwise excluded from participation in federal assistance programs or document the procedures performed to verify the vendor is not identified as suspended or debarred on EPLS.

## **University Response:**

Accepted. The University has established procedures to ensure vendors certify that their organizations are not suspended, debarred, or excluded from participation in federal assistance programs. Disclosure forms were appropriately completed for one vendor and retained for two years, according to the University's policies and procedures. The University failed to follow up with the second vendor regarding a disclosure form submitted with an incomplete debarment section.

# Finding 12-11 Inaccurate Quarterly Expenditure Reports Prepared for the SNAP Program

The University did not accurately report amounts in quarterly reports for the SNAP Program submitted to the Illinois Department of Human Services (IDHS).

The University is required to prepare a quarterly expenditure report for the SNAP program which identifies the expenditures incurred to date under the federal award. The quarterly expenditure reports are used by IDHS to monitor the University's spending under the program and to determine the amount to be reimbursed to the University (reported on the line item "Total Amount Due").

During our testwork over the quarterly expenditure report submitted for the quarter ended March 31, 2012, we noted the University inaccurately reported the "Less Payments Previously Report" line item the University as zero resulting in the "Total Amount Due" line item as zero resulting in the "Total Amount Due" line item as zero resulting in the "Total Amount Due" line item being overstated by \$1,022,734. The University did not receive an advance as the IDHS only reimbursed the quarterly amount reported through March 31, 2012.

OMB Circular A-110, Uniform Administrative Requirements for Grant and Agreements with Institutions of Higher Education, Hospitals, and Other Non-Profit Organizations, requires nonfederal entities receiving federal awards establish and maintain internal control designed to reasonably ensure compliance with federal laws, regulations, and program compliance requirements. Effective internal controls should include procedures to ensure quarterly expenditure reports accurately report the amount of cash requested for reimbursement.

In discussing these conditions with University officials, they stated that this was due to a clerical error.

Failure to prepare accurate reports inhibits the ability of the grantor to properly monitor and evaluate the performance of the program activities. (Finding Code 12-11, 11-21, 10-25, 09-21)

## **Recommendation:**

We recommend the University implement procedures to ensure the quarterly expenditure reports are accurately prepared.

#### **University Response:**

Accepted. A clerical error was made on the March 31, 2012 report resulting in an understatement of the amount previously drawn on the award. This error was corrected on the June 30, 2012 report and the University did not receive any advanced funding due to the error.

The University will work with the appropriate staff to ensure Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program Quarterly Expenditure Reports are prepared accurately.

#### Finding 12-12 Failure to Follow Property Management Regulations

The University did not consistently follow property management regulations relative to equipment purchased with federal funding from the Research and Development Cluster and Cooperative Extension Services programs.

The University conducts research and extension services in multiple locations on each of its three campuses, as well as at off-campus locations throughout the State. Equipment items purchased with federal funds are utilized at each of these locations. The University identifies all equipment in its property management records with individually assigned asset numbers and each individual asset record includes the specific location of the asset, the federal award general ledger account number which funded the purchase of the asset, and other required information. An asset tag with the assigned asset number is affixed to each asset in accordance with University policy and State Property Management Regulations.

During our physical observation of 40 pieces of equipment purchased with Research and Development Cluster funds and 50 pieces of equipment purchased with Cooperative Extension Services Program funds, we noted the following:

- One item included on the Research and Development Cluster inventory list (with a cost value of \$44,151) and one item included on the Cooperative Extension Services inventory list (with a cost value totaling \$10,500) did not have the property control tags affixed to the assets.
- Two items included on the Cooperative Extension Services inventory list (with a cost value totaling \$15,094) could not be located by the Urbana campus at the time of our procedures. Subsequently, the University was able to locate one of the items (with a cost value totaling \$8,995).

As of June 30, 2012, the cumulative cost value of equipment purchased with Research and Development Cluster and Cooperative Extension Services Program funds was \$212,183,796 and \$1,820,086, respectively.

OMB Circular A-110, Uniform Administrative Requirements for Grant and Agreements with Institutions of Higher Education, Hospitals, and Other Non-Profit Organizations (OMB Circular A-110) requires that equipment be used in the program which acquired it or, when appropriate, other federal programs. Additionally, OMB Circular A-110 requires the University to implement an appropriate control system to safeguard equipment and to ensure equipment is adequately maintained.

Additionally, OMB Circular A-110 requires nonfederal entities receiving federal awards establish and maintain internal control designed to reasonably ensure compliance with federal laws, regulations, and program compliance requirements. Effective internal controls should include procedures to ensure equipment inventory records are accurate and equipment items are properly tagged.

In discussing these conditions with University officials, they stated extensive policies and procedures are in place to ensure control over equipment; however, the University's research and cooperative extension operations are decentralized. The specific exceptions identified are the result of equipment tags being misplaced and inventory records not being updated due to untimely communication of changes.

Failure to maintain accurate property records and tag equipment purchased with federal funds prohibits the University from properly safeguarding and maintaining equipment and may result in federal programs not receiving the appropriate share of proceeds from the disposals of equipment purchased with federal funds. (Finding Code 12-12, 11-22, 10-26, 09-24)

## **Recommendation:**

We recommend the University implement procedures to ensure property records accurately reflect equipment onhand and to ensure equipment items are properly tagged in accordance with property management regulations.

#### **University Response:**

Accepted. University will continue its ongoing efforts to ensure that its property control policies/procedures are followed and identify opportunities for improvement. However, we note the following for the Cooperative Extension Services:

The item missing the tag on the UIUC campus is exposed to heat, cold, moisture and outdoor conditions common in agricultural work. Assuring that a property control tag remains affixed on equipment used in these conditions is difficult. A replacement tag will be affixed and/or the property control number etched onto the equipment.

The item included on the Cooperative Extension Services property records that was unavailable has been updated in the Property Accounting System to reflect that it has been disposed.

A property control tag was not affixed to one piece of equipment on the Chicago campus. The equipment was transported to several departments since its purchase date in 2001, and the tag likely detached during one of the relocations. A replacement tag has been affixed to the equipment.

## Finding 12-13 Inaccurate and Untimely Reporting of Student Status Changes

The University did not submit changes in the enrollment status of borrowers under the Federal Direct Loan (Direct Loan) program within required timeframes.

The University is required to report changes in a student's enrollment status to the National Student Loan Data System (NSLDS) on a periodic basis to ensure student borrowers of the Direct Loan programs begin repaying their federal loans in a timely manner. During our testwork over 65 borrowers (25 from the Urbana campus, 25 from the Chicago campus, and 15 from the Springfield campus) under the Direct Loan program that graduated, withdrew, or dropped out during the fiscal year, we noted the following:

- One status change for a student under the Direct Loan program at the Urbana campus was not accurately reporting to NSLDS within 30 days and was not included in the Student Status Confirmation Report (SSCR) within 60 days.
- Three status changes for students under the Direct Loan program at the Chicago campus were not accurately reporting to NSLDS within 30 days and was not included in the Student Status Confirmation Report (SSCR) within 60 days.
- Two status changes for students under the Direct Loan program at the Springfield campus were not accurately reporting to NSLDS within 30 days and was not included in the Student Status Confirmation Report (SSCR) within 60 days.

The University disbursed loans approximately \$500.9 million to borrowers (\$240.8 million at the Urbana campus, \$236 million at the Chicago campus, and \$24.1 at the Springfield campus) under the Direct Loan program during the year ended June 30, 2012.

According to 34 CFR 685.309, the University is required to notify the NSLDS of changes in a student borrower's status within 30 days of discovering the change, unless the University expects to complete its next Roster File within 60 days. In addition, OMB Circular A-110, *Uniform Administrative Requirements for Grant and Agreements with Institutions of Higher Education, Hospitals, and Other Non-Profit Organizations,* requires nonfederal entities receiving federal awards establish and maintain internal control designed to reasonably ensure

compliance with federal laws, regulations, and program compliance requirements. Effective internal controls should include procedures to ensure student status changes are accurately reported in a timely manner.

In discussing these conditions with University officials, they stated the exceptions were the result of timing delays.

Failure to accurately report student status changes to NSLDS in a timely manner may result in Direct Loan borrowers not entering repayment status at the appropriate time. (Finding Code 12-13, 11-25, 10-29, 09-27)

#### **Recommendation:**

We recommend the University implement procedures to ensure submissions to NSLDS are accurately reported within the required timeframe for all Direct Loan borrowers.

# **University Response:**

Accepted. The University will schedule timely submissions of status changes to the National Student Loan Data System (NSLDS) via the National Student Clearinghouse (NSC) and timely resolve any errors to facilitate complete transmission of status changes.

## Finding 12-14 Inadequate Support for Cash Draws

The University did not have accounting records to support reimbursement requests for the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) Cluster.

The University draws cash for administrative expenditures and scholarship expenditures related to the TANF Cluster on the reimbursement basis. The University's procedures for calculating reimbursement based draws generally are based upon expenditures paid and reported in the general ledger. During our testwork over cash draws performed by the Springfield campus for the TANF Cluster, we noted the University requested reimbursement of amounts in excess of expenditures reported in the general ledger as follows:

Upon further investigation of these differences, we noted there is a lag between the time expenditures are incurred and when they are reported in the general ledger due to the decentralized nature of the scholarship programs operations in the Financial Aid Offices.

OMB Circular A-110, Uniform Administrative Requirements for Grant and Agreements with Institutions of Higher Education, Hospitals, and Other Non-Profit Organizations (OMB Circular A-110), requires the University to minimize the time elapsing between the transfer of funds from the federal government and the payment of program expenditures. OMB Circular A-110 also requires nonfederal entities receiving federal awards establish and maintain internal control designed to reasonably ensure compliance with federal laws, regulations, and program compliance requirements. Effective internal controls should include procedures to ensure reimbursement requests are properly supported by the University's accounting records.

In discussing these conditions with University officials, they stated the expenditures were incurred prior to year end, but had not been posted to the general ledger due to staff turnover.

Drawing federal funds based upon information other than the University's official accounting records may result in funds being drawn in advance of the University's immediate cash needs. (Finding Code 12-14, 11-28, 10-33)

## **Recommendation:**

We recommend the University implement procedures to ensure expenditures are recorded in the general ledger as they are incurred to ensure the reimbursement requests are adequately supported by the University's official accounting records.

# **University Response:**

Accepted. The UIS Grants and Contracts Office will work with the UIS and UIC Financial Aid Offices to develop a procedure that ensures the timely posting of UIC TANF Grants to the grant fund as expenses occur. However, the University would like to note that the terminology used above for payments received (DRAW) does not by definition coincide with the billing and receipt of payment for the TANF Grant. There is also a reference in the criteria to OMB Circular A-110 related to the transfer of funds from the federal government and the payment of program expenditures that does not apply.

UIS does not do a cash draw from the federal government for the TANF Grant. An invoice is sent to the Illinois Department of Human Services, a state agency, for reimbursement of administrative fees and scholarship disbursements to students on a monthly basis. The scholarships that are issued to individual UIS student accounts automatically post to the TANF Grant. The scholarships issued to Chicago students are issued and post to a UIC fund in Banner. The TANF Grant must then be charged back for these expenses via a Journal Voucher. UIC TANF Scholarships for June 2012 were issued on June 21<sup>st</sup>, 22<sup>nd</sup>, and 28<sup>th</sup>.

When the Student Financial Aid Office prepares and submits the invoice to the UIS Grants and Contracts Office, it is posted as a receivable in Banner. The UIS Grants and Contracts Office must prepare the chargeback for the UIC Scholarships. Due to a vacancy in the Grants and Contracts Office, the chargeback was delayed. This chargeback is internal to the University and the charges were subsequently transferred to the correct fund in August 2012 and fall within the guidelines of the OBFS Policies and Procedures Manual, Section 16.1.6 –Cost Transfers Springfield Campus Supplement.

Finding 12-15 Inadequate Cash Draw and Reimbursement Request Controls

There is no documentation to substantiate that a formal review and approval of cash draw and reimbursement request calculations are performed.

The University requests cash on a reimbursement basis for its federal programs. The reimbursement request calculations for each program are prepared by staff in the Grants and Contracts Office based upon queries of expenditure information reported in the University's general ledger; however, there were no supervisory review of the cash draw and reimbursement request calculations prior to University personnel requesting the cash from the federal government.

OMB Circular A-110, Uniform Administrative Requirements for Grant and Agreements with Institutions of Higher Education, Hospitals, and Other Non-Profit Organizations (OMB Circular A-110) requires nonfederal entities receiving federal awards establish and maintain internal control designed to reasonably ensure compliance with federal laws, regulations, and program compliance requirements. Effective internal controls should include a supervisory review of all cash draw and reimbursement request calculations prior to requesting funds from a federal agency.

In discussing these conditions with University officials, they stated there are adequate controls in place for all letter of credit cash draws and reimbursement method billings.

Failure to perform supervisory reviews of cash draw and reimbursement request calculations may result in unapproved and inaccurate cash draw and reimbursement request calculations leading to noncompliance with cash management regulations. (Finding Code 12-15, 11-29, 10-34, 09-33)

#### **Recommendation:**

We recommend the University implement procedures to ensure cash draw and reimbursement request calculations are reviewed and approved prior to requesting funds from the federal government.

Schedule of Findings and Questioned Costs Current Findings – *Federal Compliance* Year ended June 30, 2012

#### **University Response:**

Not Accepted. The University has effective controls in place for cash draw calculations and cost reimbursement billings, which include steps to review the processes and amounts calculated (detailed below) in compliance with the regulatory requirements of OMB Circular A-110. Throughout the entire process there is a clear segregation of duties. The responsibility for LOC cash draws and reimbursement billings is assigned to staff with the appropriate authority, knowledge, and skill level.

Beginning in fiscal year 2012, the University no longer bases institutional letter of credit draw calculations on queries of general ledger expenditure information as noted in the Finding above. Reimbursement method billings and Letter of Credit draws represent reimbursable expenditures as billed on a monthly basis from automated processes within the University's financial system (Banner).

The University's Grants & Contracts Office (GCO) Banner Processes Section is responsible for oversight and validation of all sponsored project processes, including the receivable (billing) process and performs numerous reviews and validation checks to ensure bills and letter of credit draws are accurate before invoices and draw requests are submitted to the sponsor. Considering the large number of sponsored project billings generated by the system (52,922 in FY12), we believe these reviews represent an appropriate level of review and approval.

The reviews and oversight include:

- An automated process using the Banner System running in "audit mode" provides a spreadsheet of all grants to be billed for the period. Grants staff have three days to review awards and their related amounts that will be billed and make any necessary changes or corrections.
  - Grants staff are analyzing awards for issues such as if they are billing past the end date of the award. If staff determines charges have posted after the trail out period, the billing event can be removed from Banner to prevent the grant from billing while further inquiries are made.
  - The audit billing process also "flags" certain system coding errors that can prevent a grant from billing. These errors are sent to Grants section staff so corrections can be made before the billing entries are officially posted to Banner.
- The Banner Processes Section within the GCO executes a set of queries against Banner grant data each day to check for over 70 different data entry errors. A spreadsheet of the errors is produced each day and made available to all GCO staff. Many of the anomalies on the spreadsheet can affect the grants receivable process including cost reimbursement billings and letter of credit draws. These errors are prioritized as "high", "medium", and "low" and it is expected staff will review these errors on a daily basis and correct within the specified timeframe(s).

- Additionally, a number of reviews are performed before, during, and after the bills and letter of credit draws are produced. These checks ensure bills and letter of credit draws produced are accurate. Some examples of the verification are:
  - Queries run to ensure all transactions that should have billed were posted during the billing run.
  - o Verify no awards will bill in overdraft.
  - Ensure system settings and billing events are set up correctly for all sponsored projects.
  - o Validate automatic cash distribution postings are correct.
  - o Draw history is documented and maintained in a shared directory.
- After verifying draw and billing data produced by the system is accurate and complete, the Banner Processes Section provides a spreadsheet containing the letter of credit draw amounts.
  - The file is stored in a shared directory and an email is sent to Grants & Contracts staff responsible for requesting the draws and to Grants & Contracts management notifying them of its availability.
    - A copy of the email providing the draw information totals and spreadsheets for the Institutional Letter of Credit draws is signed off on by the Associate Director of Banner Processes.
  - This file includes the draw amount along with other financial data from Banner such as cash collections, total expenditures, total budget, etc. summarized at the award level.
  - This allows the Federal Award Section and management staff to review the draws and the financial status of all awards for a particular letter of credit.

The University sought guidance from the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) in coordination with the Department of Education and the National Science Foundation. This resulted in a Management Decision Letter (MDL) issued on February 14, 2011. According to the MDL, "The audit finding is not sustained based on our review..." The University subsequently received a letter on March 10, 2011, from HHS that states "The purpose of this communication is not to reverse our decision(s) but to clarify the nature of the finding and the direction that the University needs to take in correction of the issue(s)". The University continues to be actively engaged in collaboration with the agencies to find resolution on this issue.

#### Finding 12-16 Inadequate Approval Controls over Financial Reporting

The University does not adequately document the performance of supervisory reviews of financial reports submitted for its federal programs.

During our testwork of 30 SF-425 reports (16 quarterly reports, 13 annual reports, and one final report), three Request for Advance or Reimbursement Reports (SF 270), and nine monthly invoices submitted during fiscal year 2012, we noted the following:

- One quarterly SF-425 report (which covers four R&D Awards and two EHR awards) submitted to the National Science Foundation by the Chicago campus were prepared and certified by the same individual. The University could not provide evidence documenting a supervisory review had been performed for these reports.
- Three monthly invoices submitted to pass-through entities by the Chicago campus were prepared and signed by the same individual. The University could not provide evidence documenting a supervisory review had been performed for these reports.
- For six quarterly SF-425 reports submitted to the Army Research Office and the Department of Energy by the Urbana campus, we noted the signature of the Director of Grants and Contracts was used to evidence approval of the required financial reports; however, it appears that the report reviews were performed by supervisors within the Office of Grants and Contracts, not the Director. Since the supervisor did not sign his or her own name, we were unable to determine whether an individual other than the preparer reviewed the report prior to submission to the federal awarding agency.
- For three monthly SF-270 reports submitted to the Office of Naval Research by the Urbana campus, we noted the report appears to have been certified by the Director of Grants and Contracts; however, report submission records indicate the reports were completed, reviewed, and submitted by the same individual.
- For six monthly invoices submitted to pass-through entities by the Urbana campus, we noted the signature of the Director of Grants and Contracts was used to evidence approval of the required financial reports; however, it appears that the report reviews were performed by supervisors within the Office of Grants and Contracts, not the Director. Since the supervisor did not sign his or her own name, we were unable to determine whether an individual other than the preparer reviewed the report prior to submission to the federal awarding agency.

OMB Circular A-110, Uniform Administrative Requirements for Grant and Agreements with Institutions of Higher Education, Hospitals, and Other Non-Profit Organizations (OMB Circular A-110) requires nonfederal entities receiving federal awards establish and maintain internal control designed to reasonably ensure compliance with federal laws, regulations, and program compliance requirements. Effective internal controls should include a documented supervisory review to ensure the accuracy of all financial reports submitted to the federal agencies.

In discussing these conditions with University officials, they stated the University has effective internal controls. A supervisory review is done prior to the submission of financial status reports; however, formal documentation of the review is not required. OMB Circular A-133 requires the University to establish and maintain internal control designed to provide reasonable assurance that Federal awards are managed in compliance with federal

laws, regulations, and program compliance requirements. University officials stated that there is no specific requirement for documentation of a supervisory review.

Failure to perform supervisory reviews of financial reports may result in the submission of inaccurate reports which would inhibit the ability of the grantor to properly monitor and evaluate the performance of the program activities. (Finding Code 12-16, 11-30)

## **Recommendation:**

We recommend the University implement procedures to ensure the financial reports submitted for its federal awards are reviewed and approved by someone other than the preparer.

# **University Response:**

Not Accepted. For the Urbana-Champaign campus: The signature required on the report is the signature of the Authorized Certifying Official. *The Certifying Official is the individual who has the knowledge and authority to certify that the figures reported on the SF-425 are accurate and complete.* The employees who prepare and review are determining that the reports are accurate and complete, but do not have the authority to certify them as required, nor is their signature required. A supervisory review is done prior to the submission of financial status reports. OMB Circular A-133 requires the University to establish and maintain internal control designed to provide reasonable assurance that Federal awards are managed in compliance with federal laws, regulations, and program compliance requirements. There is no specific requirement for documentation of a supervisory review.

For the Chicago Campus: The University has procedures in place to ensure that financial reports are reviewed by another party prior to submission. A preliminary analysis of the SF-425 reports submitted to NSF was completed by the Urbana campus and an Excel spreadsheet was sent to the Chicago campus via email for review. Upon review and approval from the Chicago campus, the spreadsheet was returned to an Urbana preparer to finalize and submit the report. The related email communication demonstrating this process was provided to the firm as evidence of the supervisory review.

The monthly invoices submitted by the Chicago campus were uploaded into Wide Area Workflow (WAWF), a web-based electronic billing system is used by the Department of Defense. The unit administering the grant prepares and submits billing data to the Grants & Contracts Office via email for review and submission into the WAWF system. The Grants and Contracts Office is denoted as the initiator and submitter on the WAWF summary page because billing access is limited to the Grants and Contracts office for internal control purposes. The related email communication demonstrating this process was provided to the firm as evidence of the supervisory review.

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#### Auditors' Comment:

We believe effective internal control should include a documented review and approval of required financial reports and we were unable to obtain evidence that the financial reports had been reviewed and approved by an individual other than the preparer. Additionally, we noted the Management Decision Letter from the Office of Naval Research dated October 1, 2012, stated that the University completed a report review checklist which required the signature of a supervisor; however, a signed checklist was not available for any of the reports sampled.

#### Finding 12-17 – Inadequate Procedures to Remove Inactive Employees From Payroll System

The University has not established adequate procedures to identify and remove inactive hourly employees from the payroll system in a timely manner.

The University's process for removing terminated employees generally begins with academic or administrative department personnel notifying Human Resources when an employee has separated from the University and should be removed from the payroll system. During our audit, we noted certain academic and administrative departments do not report separations of hourly employees to Human Resources when they expect the separation from the University to be temporary (i.e. semester break, seasonal employment, etc.). As a result, there are several hourly employees that remain eligible to be paid in the payroll system with the submission of a timesheet, but who have not received pay from the University in more than 6 months. Specifically, we noted the following related to the hourly employees eligible to be paid from the University's payroll system:

Our audit identified other controls and processes that the University has implemented to mitigate the risk that payroll costs are improperly paid. These controls include formal approvals of timesheets by supervisors and required reviews of labor distribution reports and project ledgers by departmental employees.

Despite these additional controls, we noted the University identified an instance in which a terminated employee received payroll disbursements totaling \$72,039 over the course of a four year period after the employee was terminated by the University (of which \$16,906 pertained to fiscal year 2012). Of this amount, \$10,996 related to amounts charged to federal programs over the course of the four year period (none of which related to fiscal year 2012).

Total payroll disbursements made to hourly employees totaled \$633,932,039 during the year ended June 30, 2012.

The Fiscal Control and Internal Auditing Act (Illinois Compiled Statues Chapter 30 Section 10/3001), requires the University to establish and maintain a system, or systems, of internal fiscal and administrative controls, which shall provide assurance that: (1) resources are utilized efficiently, effectively, and in compliance with applicable law; (2) obligations and costs are in compliance with applicable law; (3) funds, property, and other assets and resources are safeguarded against waste, loss, and unauthorized use; (4) revenues, expenditures, and transfers of assets, resources, or funds applicable to operations are properly recorded and accounted for to permit the preparation of accounts and reliable financial and statistical reports and to maintain accountability over the State's resources; and (5) funds held outside the State Treasury are managed, used, and obtained in strict accordance with the terms of their enabling authorities and that no unauthorized funds exist. The University's system of internal controls should include procedures to ensure terminated employees and inactive employee appointments are identified and removed from the payroll system and information systems in a timely manner.

In discussing these conditions with University officials, they stated that some units did not have adequate processes in place to reliably notify Human Resources when certain hourly employees needed to be terminated. They further indicated that the weaknesses identified largely involved employee appointment types having irregular work schedules or temporary work assignments.

Failure to properly deactivate terminated employees from the payroll system and remove their access to the time reporting and other information systems could result in fraudulent payroll disbursements being made to former employees and/or other unauthorized transactions being processed by the University's information systems. (Finding Code 12-17)

## Recommendation

We recommend the University implement procedures to identify and remove inactive employees from the payroll system in a timely manner.

## **University Response:**

Accepted. The University will develop and implement corrective actions to address the recommendation in this finding.

#### Finding 12-18 – Contracts and Real Estate Leases Not Properly Executed

The University has not established adequate internal controls over contracts and leases to ensure they contain all necessary approvals, are executed prior to performance, and are filed with the State of Illinois Office of the Comptroller on a timely basis.

During our review of 70 contracts, including purchase orders, executed during the year ended June 30, 2012, we noted the following:

- 28 contracts did not contain the signature of the employee signing on behalf of the University Comptroller.
- 24 contracts were not signed by University's Chief Executive Officer or Chief Legal Counsel out of 37 contracts sampled requiring this level of approval.
- 14 contracts were executed subsequent to performance of the contracts. The contract execution dates ranged from 1 to 288 days after the beginning of the contract start dates.
- One contract was not published in the Illinois Procurement Bulletin out of 54 contracts sampled required to be published.
- One contract did not contain disclosure of financial interest statement.
- 31 contracts were not submitted to the Comptroller's office, as required. Six of the 31 contracts were filed 7-26 days late and 25 contracts were not submitted at all.

During our review of 40 real estate leases executed during the year ended June 30, 2012, we noted the following:

- Two leases were executed after the lease term began. The lease execution dates ranged from 34 days to 62 days after the beginning of the lease.
- Three Real Estate Lease Disclosure forms were signed after the beginning of the lease term.
- One lease contract was paid more than the amount indicated in the lease agreement by \$1,000.
- Three leases were not submitted to the State Comptroller's Office within the required timeframes. Late filings ranged from 27 to 76 days late.

During our review of 26 emergency purchases for the year ended June 30, 2012 we noted the following:

- Five artistic services contracts were procured as an emergency purchase when none of the emergency purchase conditions were met.
- Four emergency purchases were not published in the Illinois Procurement Bulletin within the required timeframes. Delays in publishing these purchases ranged from 6 to 49 days after the required timeframe.
- Three emergency purchases were not filed timely to the Office of the Auditor General within the required timeframes. The emergency purchases were filed 3 to 45 days late.

The Illinois Procurement Code (30 ILCS 500 <u>et seq.</u>) and Statewide Accounting Management System (Procedure 15.20 <u>et seq.</u> and 15.10.40) requires contracts and real estate leases to contain certain signatures, clauses, and certifications and also require State agencies to file contracts for professional and artistic services exceeding \$5,000 and all other contracts and leases exceeding \$10,000 with the State Comptroller within 15 calendar days after execution. The Emergency Purchases Section (c) Affidavits of the Illinois Procurement Code (30 ILCS

500/20-30) states that a chief procurement officer shall file affidavits with the Procurement Policy Board and the Auditor General of the State of Illinois within 10 days after the procurement setting forth the amount expended, the name of the contractor involved, and the conditions and circumstances requiring the emergency procurement. Further, the State Finance Act (30 ILCS 105/9.02) states that any new contract, contract renewal, order against a master contract, or any contract amendment of \$250,000 or more in a fiscal year, shall be signed or approved in writing by the agency's chief executive officer, chief legal counsel and chief fiscal officer.

In addition, the University of Illinois Business and Financial Policies and Procedures (Section 2.3) and good business practices require all contracts and leases to be fully executed prior to the beginning of the lease term or the commencement of services. Additionally, the Fiscal Control and Internal Auditing Act (30 ILCS 10/3001), requires the University to establish and maintain a system or systems of internal fiscal and administrative controls, which shall provide assurance that: (1) resources are utilized effectively, and in compliance with applicable law (2) obligations and cost are in compliance with applicable law; (3) funds, property, and other assets and resources are safeguarded against waste, loss, unauthorized use, and misappropriation; (4) revenues, expenditures, and transfers of assets, resources or funds applicable to operations are properly recorded and accounted for to permit preparation of accounts and reliable financial and statistical reports and to maintain accountability over the State's resources; and (5) fund held outside the State Treasury are managed, used, and obtained in strict accordance with the terms of their enabling authorities and that no unauthorized funds exist. The University's system of internal controls should include procedures to ensure contracts and leases contain all necessary provisions and are properly executed prior to the performance.

In discussing these conditions with University officials, they stated exceptions can be attributed to changes in requirements for documents, human error, and documents not being received in the Contract Records Office in a timely manner.

Failure to fully execute a contract or real estate lease prior to the commencement of services or lease term and failure to properly execute emergency purchases leaves the University vulnerable to unnecessary liabilities and potential legal issues. In addition, failure to include all appropriate signature, clauses, and certifications in contracts and leases or file contracts, real estate leases, and emergency purchases with the Office of the Comptroller and the Auditor General of the State of Illinois on a timely basis results in noncompliance with State statutes and regulations (Finding Code 12-18, 11-32, 10-35, 09-35, 08-09, 07-10, 06-07, 05-05, 04-05, 03-06)

## Recommendation

We recommend the University establish appropriate procedures to ensure all contracts and leases are completed, approved and properly executed prior to the start of the services and lease term and that emergency purchases are properly executed. Further, the University should review procedures to ensure all appropriate signatures, clauses, and certifications are obtained prior to execution for all contracts and lease agreements and all applicable contracts, real estate leases, and emergency purchases are filed with the Office of the Comptroller and the Auditor General of the State of Illinois in accordance with the State statutes and related guidelines.

## **University Response:**

Accepted. The University will continue to review requirements related to contractual services, establish any new procedures that may be required, and continue to enforce current policies and practices.

# Finding 12-19 – Failure to Follow Time Reporting Requirements

The University does not require all employees to submit time sheets as required by the State Officials and Employees Ethics Act. The University does not require faculty employees to submit time sheets as required by the State Officials and Employees Ethics Act.

During our testing of payroll, we selected 60 employees across all three campuses and noted that 15 faculty employees did not file timesheets as required by the State Officials and Employees Ethics Act. Based upon inquiry of the University management, employees classified as board members and faculty continue to generally track their time using a "negative" timekeeping system whereby the employee is assumed to be working unless noted otherwise.

The State Officials and Employees Ethics Act (the Act) (5 ILCS 430/1-5) defines "State agency" to include "public institutions of higher learning..." and defines "State employee" to be "any employee of a State agency." The Act required the Illinois Board of Higher Education (IBHE), with respect to State employees of public universities, to adopt and implement personnel policies. The Act (5 ILCS 430/1-5) also states, "The policies shall require State employees to periodically submit time sheets documenting the time spent each day on official State business to the nearest quarter hour; contractual State employees may satisfy the time sheets requirement by complying with the terms of their contract, which shall provide for a means of compliance with this requirement." The IBHE adopted personnel policies for public universities on February 3, 2004 in accordance with the Act. The University has not incorporated these policies into the University's policies.

In discussing these conditions with University officials, they stated the implementation of the system for positive time reporting for University Academic Professionals and Exempt Civil Service staff is in force since the beginning of fiscal year 2011. All Non-Exempt Civil Service employees throughout the University have been reporting their time in accordance with the State University Civil Service System and all faculty report time not worked.

Failure to follow the time reporting requirements of the Act results in noncompliance with State statute. (Finding Code 12-19, 11-33, 10-37, 09-40, 08-11, 07-11, 06-06, 05-06)

## Recommendation

We recommend the University implement procedures to ensure all employees submit time sheets as required by the Act.

## **University Response:**

Accepted. There is ongoing dialogue with the academic leadership at each University campus regarding further implementation of this requirement.

#### Finding 12-20 – Inadequate Controls over User Access to Information Systems

The University has not established adequate internal controls over access to the information systems used in its financial reporting process.

The University operates an Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) system to manage the activities of the University, in addition to operating and supporting information systems for purchasing and human resource. The University functions in a highly distributed operating environment with several thousand users having varying types of system access. During our review of user access rights we identified several users with rights that were inappropriate based on their roles and job functions presenting segregation of duties conflicts and the risk that erroneous or fraudulent transactions may be recorded in the general ledger. We identified the following exceptions regarding improper authorization or inappropriate access rights based upon review of each user's job function:

- There are 264 terminated users (out of 713 total terminated users) with active accounts that were not removed in a timely manner. Delays in removing access for terminated employees ranged from 32 to 248 days after the employee's separation from the University.
- Of the 264 terminated users referenced above, there were 12 terminated user accounts with active accounts that were accessed after the employee's separation from the University. According to the University, 17 of the users accessed their user accounts after separation from the University under the knowledge and authorization of their supervisors. However, these authorizations were not formally documented.
- There was one user (out of 40 total users) with inappropriate access to update the general ledger chart of accounts.
- There was one new user account of the patient billing system (out of a sample of 25 new user accounts) that was not properly authorized by the service provider who granted the user account.

The University's information technology department implemented procedures, which were in place for all of fiscal 2012, to perform terminated employee access reviews on a daily basis. However, this procedure alone was not sufficient to provide timely removal of access of terminated employees. The Fiscal Control and Internal Auditing Act (Illinois Compiled Statues Chapter 30 Section 10/3001), requires the University to establish and maintain a system, or systems, of internal fiscal and administrative controls, which shall provide assurance that: (1) resources are utilized efficiently, effectively, and in compliance with applicable law; (2) obligations and costs are in compliance with applicable law; (3) funds, property, and other assets and resources are safeguarded against waste, loss, and unauthorized use; (4) revenues, expenditures, and transfers of assets, resources, or funds applicable to operations are properly recorded and accounted for to permit the preparation of accounts and reliable financial and statistical reports and to maintain accountability over the State's resources; and (5) funds held outside the State Treasury are managed, used, and obtained in strict accordance with the terms of their enabling authorities and that no unauthorized funds exist. The University's system of internal controls should include procedures to ensure access rights granted to University employees are appropriate and to document monitoring procedures of the appropriateness of access levels on a continuing basis. In addition, generally accepted information technology guidance endorses the development of well-designed and well-managed controls to protect computer systems and data. Effective computer security controls provide for safeguarding,

securing, and controlling access to systems, properly segregating incompatible duties, and protecting against misappropriation.

In discussing these conditions with University personnel, they stated that the exceptions largely resulted from delays by unit human resources personnel in requesting their respective unit security contacts to remove access for the terminated employees. The exception involving inappropriate access to update the general ledger chart of accounts resulted from an error by the related unit security contact.

Failure to properly assign and monitor user access rights may result in erroneous or fraudulent transactions being recorded in the general ledger system. Without adequate security over access rights, there is a greater risk that unauthorized changes or additions to the University's financial systems could occur and not be detected in a timely manner. (Finding Code 12-20, 11-02, 10-01, 09-01, 08-05)

## Recommendation

We recommend the University implement procedures to ensure the user access rights for terminated employees are removed in a timely manner.

#### **University Response:**

Accepted. The University will continue to enhance controls in this area. As such, corrective actions will be implemented to address the recommendation in this finding.

### Finding 12-21 – Inadequate Controls over Intercompany Revenue and Expense Transactions

The University has not established adequate internal controls over identifying and eliminating intercompany transactions during the preparation of the consolidated financial statements.

The University's financial activity includes auxiliary and educational revenues from housing, parking and student activities, student service fees, various user fees, room and board charges, catering services, sales from merchandise/vending, and rental of certain facilities. These services are provided to students, customers external to the University, and internal user departments within the University. Intercompany sales billed to user departments within the University are typically recognized as revenue for one department and expense for the same amount to the user department. The University's process for identifying revenues and expenses recognized from intercompany sales includes the elimination of storeroom and service fund revenues and expenses during the preparation of the consolidated financial statements. However, other types of general ledger funds including auxiliary enterprises, educational activities and service plan funds provide services to customers external to the University and also to departments within the University. During our audit we noted the University did not have a process to identify and eliminate intercompany transactions recorded in these types of general ledger funds. We noted the University recognized a total of \$45,786,181 in intercompany auxiliary enterprises, educational activity and service plan revenue and related expense the consolidated financial statements during the year ended June 30, 2012.

Total revenues recorded in the University financial statements for auxiliary enterprises, educational activities and the medical service plan for the year ended June 30, 2012 were \$363,319,000, \$258,298,000 and \$236,160,000, respectively.

Generally accepted accounting principles do not permit the recognition of intercompany revenue transactions or any resulting profit or loss on those sales. Additionally, the Fiscal Control and Internal Auditing Act (Illinois Compiled Statutes Chapter 30 Section 10/3001), requires the University to establish and maintain a system, or systems, of internal fiscal and administrative controls, which shall provide assurance that: (1) resources are utilized efficiently, effectively, and in compliance with applicable law; (2) obligations and costs are in compliance with applicable law; (3) funds, property, and other assets and resources are safeguarded against waste, loss, unauthorized use, and misappropriation; (4) revenues, expenditures, and transfers of assets, resources, or funds applicable to operations are properly recorded and accounted for to permit the preparation of accounts and reliable financial and statistical reports and to maintain accountability over the State's resources; and (5) funds held outside the State Treasury are managed, used, and obtained in strict accordance with the terms of their enabling authorities and that no unauthorized funds exist. The University's system of internal controls should include procedures to properly identify and eliminate intercompany sales transactions during the preparation of the consolidated financial statements.

In discussing these conditions with University personnel, they stated that processes had not been in place to eliminate intercompany revenues and expenses for the fund types identified in the exceptions.

Failure to properly identify and eliminate intercompany revenue transactions during the preparation of the financial statements may result in the misstatement of the University's financial statements. (Finding Code 12-21)

Schedule of Findings and Questioned Costs Current Findings – *State Compliance* Year ended June 30, 2012

#### Recommendation

We recommend the University review its current process to preparing the financial statements and consider changes necessary to ensure all intercompany revenue transactions are properly identified and eliminated from the financial statements.

# **University Response:**

Accepted. The University has developed and implemented corrective actions to address the recommendation in this finding.

#### Finding 12-22 – Uncollateralized Deposit Accounts

The University has not established adequate internal controls over requiring adequate collateral for all public funds held at a banking institution where those funds are not covered by the FDIC.

During our audit, we noted the University held investments in certificates of deposit totaling \$7,751,000 as of June 30, 2012. In relation to our testwork over investments, we confirmed the existence of these certificates of deposit with the third party custodian. We noted that four certificates of deposit (totaling \$7,350,000), each held at a different financial institution, exceeded the FDIC insurance limit of \$250,000. The amounts exceeding the FDIC limit for the four certificates of deposit were not secured with collateral by the respective financial institution.

The Fiscal Control and Internal Auditing Act (Illinois Compiled Statutes Chapter 30 Section 10/3001), requires the University to establish and maintain a system, or systems, of internal fiscal and administrative controls, which shall provide assurance that: (1) resources are utilized efficiently, effectively, and in compliance with applicable law; (2) obligations and costs are in compliance with applicable law; (3) funds, property, and other assets and resources are safeguarded against waste, loss, unauthorized use, and misappropriation; (4) revenues, expenditures, and transfers of assets, resources, or funds applicable to operations are properly recorded and accounted for to permit the preparation of accounts and reliable financial and statistical reports and to maintain accountability over the State's resources; and (5) funds held outside the State Treasury are managed, used, and obtained in strict accordance with the terms of their enabling authorities and that no unauthorized funds exist. The University's system of internal controls should include procedures to require adequate collateral for all public funds held at banking institutions where those funds are not covered by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC).

In discussing these conditions with University officials, they stated the investment managers who purchased the certificates of deposit were not aware of the collateralization requirements.

Failure to obtain collateral for deposits held at financial institutions puts the University funds at risk in the event that the financial institution incurs financial difficulties. (Finding Code 12-22)

#### Recommendation

We recommend the University review its current policy to require collateral from banking institutions where deposits exceed FDIC limits.

#### **University Response:**

Accepted. The University will take the necessary corrective action to address the recommendation in this finding.

# Finding 12-23 – Inadequate Controls over University Travel Card Transactions

The University has not established adequate internal control over travel reimbursement transactions.

The University operates a travel card program which allows individuals traveling for University business to make qualified travel expenses and business meals on a credit card which is directly reimbursed by the University on a monthly basis. The University's policies require employees assigned a travel card to complete training on policies and procedures and sign an agreement stipulating they will use the card in accordance with University policy. The University's policies require transactions incurred on the procurement card to be approved in the University's procurement card system by the individual cardholder and an assigned reviewer. However, during our testwork over 40 travel card transactions (totaling \$62,312), we noted two transactions for \$926 for charges prohibited by the University's travel card policies.

The University has approximately 2,900 active travel cards and the travel card expenditures paid for the year ended June 30, 2012 totaled \$4,633,773.

Fiscal Control and Internal Auditing Act (30 ILCS 10/3001), requires the University to establish and maintain a system or systems of internal fiscal and administrative controls, which shall provide assurance that: (1) resources are utilized effectively, and in compliance with applicable law (2) obligations and cost are in compliance with applicable law; (3) funds, property, and other assets and resources are safeguarded against waste, loss, unauthorized use, and misappropriation; (4) revenues, expenditures, and transfers of assets, resources or funds applicable to operations are properly recorded and accounted for to permit preparation of accounts and reliable financial and statistical reports and to maintain accountability over the State's resources; and (5) fund held outside the State Treasury are managed, used, and obtained in strict accordance with the terms of their enabling authorities and that no unauthorized funds exist. The University's system of internal controls should include procedures to ensure procurement transactions are properly reviewed and approved to avoid erroneous transactions from being paid and recorded.

In discussing these conditions with University officials, they stated these exceptions were related to employees misunderstanding the University travel card policies.

Failure to properly review and approve travel card transactions could result in erroneous or fraudulent transactions being recorded in the general ledger system. (Finding Code 12-23)

### Recommendation

We recommend the University review its current process for reviewing and approving travel card transactions and consider any changes necessary to ensure charges are made in accordance with University policies and procedures. Additionally, we recommend the University seek reimbursement of these prohibited expenditures from the travelers.

Schedule of Findings and Questioned Costs Current Findings – *State Compliance* Year ended June 30, 2012

#### **University Response:**

Accepted. T-Card transactions are reviewed to make sure University policy is followed. The University will continue to educate users and follow up with reports to monitor compliance. The two transactions noted in this finding are not considered unallowable costs by the University; however, they were not processed appropriately under our policies. One of the transactions (for registration for a conference) should have been charged on a P-Card, not a T-Card. One of the transactions (payment for GPS service) required an approval as an exception, which was not done in advance.

# Finding 12-24 – Improper Classification of General Ledger Expenditures

The University did not properly code and classify certain expenditures from vendor payments in the general ledger system.

The University's procurement and vendor payment processes is a multistep process that requires user departments to create purchase order for needed goods or services, user departments acknowledging receipts of goods and services from the related vendor, and the accounts payable department receiving and approving vendor invoices for payment. When user departments create and approve purchase orders, the purchases are initially assigned a general ledger coding that matches the nature of the goods and services being purchased. And before approving an invoice for payment, the accounts payable department reviews the general ledger coding of vendor invoices. However, during our review of 205 expense transactions recorded during the fiscal year totaling \$51,918,571, we noted transactions that were not properly coded in the general ledger, and thus, were misclassified. Specifically, we noted the following:

- One purchase of medical equipment and supplies (totaling \$24,744) was improperly classified as a building and grounds maintenance expense.
- One purchase of automatic door maintenance and repair (totaling \$16,400) was improperly classified as a medical human subject expense.
- One purchase of general equipment maintenance and repair (totaling \$10,355) was improperly classified as office equipment rental expense.
- One travel reimbursement related to employees participating in an international study abroad program (totaling \$21,175) was improperly classified as instate carpool travel expense.

The Fiscal Control and Internal Auditing Act (30 ILCS 10/3001) requires the Agency to establish and maintain a system or systems of internal fiscal and administrative controls, which shall provide assurance that revenues, expenditures, and transfers of assets, resources, or funds applicable to operations are properly recorded and accounted for to permit the preparation of accounts and reliable financial and statistical reports and to maintain a accountability over the State's resources. Effective internal controls should include a process to ensure that expenditure vouchers are processed accurately.

In discussing these conditions with University officials, they stated these exceptions were related to human error during the expense coding process.

Failure to properly review and classify expense transactions may result in the misstatement of the University's financial statements. (Finding Code 12-24)

### Recommendation

We recommend the University review its process for coding expense transactions and consider any changes necessary to ensure expenses are properly coded and classified in the general ledger.

Schedule of Findings and Questioned Costs Current Findings – *State Compliance* Year ended June 30, 2012

# **University Response:**

Accepted. The new Travel & Expense Management system (TEM) contains more precise information regarding account codes than the previous paper voucher system.

#### Finding 12-25 – Inaccurate Inventory Records

The University does not have an adequate process to measure inventory balances as of fiscal year-end (i.e. balance sheet date).

The University performs annual physical inventory counts for large balances of goods and supplies held on hand such as the University bookstores books and merchandise, hospital supplies, medical center pharmaceuticals, general office supplies, and telecommunication supplies. The results of these physical inventory counts are used to record inventory balances so that amounts reported at year-end are based on actual quantities on hand as of the balance sheet date. During our testwork over physical inventory counts at the Materials Management department of the University of Illinois Hospital, the Chicago Academic Computing and Communication Center, the Urbana Campus Information and Technologies and Educational Services, the University bookstores, and the Radiology Department, we selected a sample of 240 inventory items (totaling \$774,180) that were counted at year-end and performed test counts, in which we noted the following:

- One item (totaling \$24,150) at the Chicago Academic Computing and Communication Center did not agree with department's inventory records resulting in an overstatement of \$18,113.
- One item (totaling \$9,910) at the Hospital Operating Room did not agree with the department's inventory records resulting in an overstatement of \$1,293.
- One item (totaling \$441) at the Hospital Material Management department did not agree with the department's inventory records resulting in an understatement of \$21.
- One item (totaling \$145) at the Hospital Material Management department did not agree with the department's inventory records resulting in an overstatement of \$31.
- Five items (totaling \$556) at the Campus Information and Technologies and Educational Services department did not agree with the department's inventory records resulting in an understatement of \$55.
- Two items (totaling \$747) at the Campus Information and Technologies and Educational Services department did not agree with the department's inventory records resulting in an overstatement of \$688.
- One item (totaling \$447) at the Bookstore did not agree with the department's inventory records resulting in an understatement of \$28.
- The final inventory records for one item (totaling \$30,205) at the Chicago Academic Computing and Communication Center did not agree with the year-end inventory records resulting in an overstatement of \$1,777.
- The final inventory records for three items (totaling \$22) at the Campus Information and Technologies and Educational Services department did not agree with the year-end inventory records resulting in an understatement of \$562.

- The final inventory records for three items (totaling \$894) at the Campus Information and Technologies and Educational Services department did not agree with the year-end inventory records resulting in an overstatement of \$761.
- One inventory adjustment of the bookstore was incorrectly posted to the general ledger resulting in an overstatement of \$102,685.

Inventory balances of goods and supplies held on hand by the University totaled \$32,481,060 as of the year ended June 30, 2012.

The Fiscal Control and Internal Auditing Act (30 ILCS 10/3001) requires the Agency to establish and maintain a system or systems of internal fiscal and administrative controls, which shall provide assurance that revenues, expenditures, and transfers of assets, resources, or funds applicable to operations are properly recorded and accounted for to permit the preparation of accounts and reliable financial and statistical reports and to maintain accountability over the State's resources. Effective internal controls should include a process of performing accurate inventory counts so that amounts reported at year-end are based on actual quantities on hand as of balance sheet date.

In discussing these conditions with University officials, they stated the differences were due to data entry errors and oversight during the physical counts.

Failure to perform accurate physical inventory counts of actual on quantities on hand at year-end results in inventory balances being inaccurately reported in the University's financial statements at year-end. (Finding Code 12-25, 11-34, 10-38)

#### Recommendation

We recommend the University review its process for performing physical inventory counts and consider any changes necessary to ensure physical inventory counts are accurate and amounts reported at year-end are based on actual quantities on hand as of balance sheet date.

#### **University Response:**

Accepted. The University will take the necessary corrective action to address the recommendation in this finding.

#### Finding 12-26 – Use of University Vehicles

The University did not report certain automobile accidents involving University vehicles to the Department of Central Management Services in a timely manner.

During our testing of the operation of University vehicles, we noted that the University reported 136 accidents involving University vehicles to the Department of Central Management Services (CMS) during fiscal year 2012. Of the 101 accidents reported by the Urbana campus 14 (14%) were not reported timely and ranged from two to 43 days late. Of the 33 accidents reported by the Chicago campus, 6 (18%) were not reported timely and ranged from one to 146 days late.

The Illinois Administrative Code (44 Ill. Admin. Code 5040.520) states a driver of a state owned or leased vehicle which is involved in an accident of any type shall report such accident to the appropriate law enforcement agency and to CMS by completing the "Motorist's Report of Illinois Motor Vehicle Accident" form (SR 1). For all accidents, the Form SR 1 is to be completed as soon as possible and submitted to the office of the current insurance carrier. In no case is this report to be completed later than three (3) days following an accident.

Additionally, University of Illinois Office of Business and Financial Services Policies and Procedures (Section 15.3) state that the responsible personnel at each campus "must deliver the accident report to the CMS within seven calendar days of the accident in all cases."

In discussing these conditions with University officials, they stated these exceptions are due to 1) the campus offices not knowing about reportable accidents until the units report them, after which time is needed to gather the information required by CMS and 2) misunderstanding by employees as well as their supervisors due to their unfamiliarity with University policy.

Failure to report automobile accidents to the Department of Central Management Services in a timely manner may cause the University to be denied coverage and result in additional liabilities for the University. (Finding Code 12-26, 11-36, 10-41, 09-46, 08-10)

### Recommendation

We recommend the University implement procedures to ensure that accident reports are submitted to the Department of Central Management Services in a timely manner. We also recommend the University ensure that policies and procedures are clearly understood and followed by all personnel responsible for the oversight of University vehicles within each department.

#### **University Response:**

Accepted. The University recognizes that employees as well as their employing units must take responsibility for the prompt reporting of auto accidents and will continue efforts to ensure compliance. University policies were revised to be easier to read and understand, letters of reprimand are being sent to unit heads when late reporting occurs, outlining the requirement for prompt reporting, and informational brochures will continue to be placed in the glove boxes of university autos for ready reference.

### Finding 12-27 – Inadequate Documentation of Personal Use of State Vehicles

The University failed to maintain documentation related to the approval of personal use of State vehicles.

The University policy and procedures prohibit personal use of State motor vehicles. However, exceptions may be granted under specific circumstances and for legitimate, non-compensatory business reasons, where the reasons for such use must be documented and approved by the President, Comptroller, or Chancellors. Moreover, the University requires employees granted exception to submit annual certification related to licensure and liability insurance or within 30 days of any new assignment of a vehicle on an ongoing basis, whichever is later.

During our test work over submission of licensure and liability insurance certification for all 11 employees with assigned vehicles, we noted the University did not maintain the initial approval granting personal use of the vehicles for two employees. In addition, for one employee, we could not verify the annual certifications related to licensure and liability insurance were completed within the required 30 days.

According to 44 Illinois Administrative Code, Chapter I, Section 5040.340, vehicles may be assigned to specific individuals if authorized in writing by the head of the agency to which the vehicle is assigned and the employee's work assignment requires traveling to numerous locations over a considerable territory with infrequent stops at the employee's headquarters. In addition, The Illinois Vehicle Code (625 ILCS 5/7-601(c)) requires every employee of a State agency, who is assigned a specific vehicle owned or leased by the State on an ongoing basis shall provide a certification related to licensure and liability insurance annually to the director or chief executive officer of his or her agency. The certification shall be provided during the period July 1 through July 31 of each calendar year, or within 30 days of any new assignment of a vehicle on an ongoing basis, whichever is later.

In discussing these conditions with University officials, they stated the University properly approved the personal use of the vehicles and obtained the required licensure and liability insurance within the required 30 days.

Failure to properly maintain vehicle authorization forms may result in noncompliance with the requirements of the Illinois Vehicle Code and to misuse of state resources. (Finding Code 12-27)

### Recommendation

We recommend the University review its current procedures for maintaining vehicle authorization forms and consider any change necessary to ensure documentation is maintained in accordance the Illinois Vehicle Code.

### **University Response:**

Accepted. Approval letters for both employees were issued on 6/28/12. The certification of liability insurance for the one employee was provided after 30 days.

#### Finding 12-28 – Sabbatical Reports Not Submitted in Accordance with University Policies and Procedures

The University does not have adequate procedures to monitor submission of sabbatical reports from employees returning from sabbatical leaves.

During our review of 25 employees who returned from sabbatical leave and were required to submit a sabbatical report during fiscal year ended June 30, 2012, we noted the following:

- One employee did not submit the required written sabbatical report on their activities, study, and travel during the leave.
- Three employees did not submit their written sabbatical reports within the required timeframes, ranging from 214 to 233 days late.

The University's formal policy on Sabbatical Leaves requires faculty members to submit, in duplicate, a written report on his or her activities, study, and travel during the leave upon returning from a sabbatical leave. The submission of sabbatical reports should be made through the normal channel, through executive officer, dean/director, or Chancellor. In addition, Springfield campus' Faculty Personnel Policy requires faculty to submit the report in the year following the sabbatical.

In discussing these conditions with University officials, they stated that current year monitoring deficiencies were due to staff turnover and human error.

Failure to submit written sabbatical reports summarizing employee activities, study, and travel during the leave inhibits the University's ability to monitor employee sabbatical leaves and results in noncompliance with the University's policies and procedures. (Finding Code 12-28)

#### Recommendation

We recommend the University review its process for monitoring employee sabbatical leaves and consider any changes necessary to ensure all written sabbatical leave reports are properly completed and submitted within the required timeframes.

#### **University Response:**

Accepted. The UIS Provost Office reviewed the sabbatical reporting process and will implement the appropriate procedures.

# Finding 12-29 – Failure to Comply with Minimum Fuel Economy Standards

The University failed to ensure vehicles purchased complied with the minimum fuel economy standards.

During our testwork of 25 new vehicles purchased by the University during the fiscal year ended June 30, 2012, we noted 7 new vehicles did not comply with the minimum gas mileage standards on fuel economy. Specifically, the average mile per gallon for these vehicles ranged from 4.5 to 5.5 miles per gallon less than the required minimum fuel efficiency standard of 27.5 miles per gallon. In addition, the University did not request a formal exemption from the Department of Central Management Services in relation to these purchases.

The University purchased 138 new vehicles during the year ended June 30, 2012.

The Illinois Procurement Code (30 ILCS 500/45-40) states that contracts for the purchase or lease of new passenger automobiles, other than station wagons, vans, four-wheel drive vehicles, emergency vehicles, and police and fire vehicles, shall specify the procurement of a model that, according to the most current mileage study published by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, can achieve at least the minimum average fuel economy in miles per gallon imposed upon manufacturers of vehicles under Title V of the Motor Vehicle Information and Cost Savings Act (the Act). However, the State purchasing officer may exempt procurements from the requirement of subsection (a) when there is a demonstrated need, submitted in writing, for an automobile that does not meet the minimum average fuel economy standards. Under the Act, the average fuel economy standard for passenger automobiles manufactured by a manufacturer in a model year after model year 1984 shall be 27.5 mpg.

In discussing these conditions with University officials, they stated conflicting State statutes related to the fuel efficiency of State vehicles made complying with this statute impossible.

Failure to purchase vehicles that comply with the minimum fuel economy standards without obtaining the proper exemption results in noncompliance with the Act and may result in inefficient use of state resources. (Finding Code 12-29)

### Recommendation

We recommend the University ensure that vehicles purchased comply with the minimum fuel economy standards and that written requests are properly submitted to the Department of Central Management Services for vehicles purchased below the average minimum gas mileage standards.

### **University Response:**

Accepted. The University will work through the UI Office of Governmental Relations toward seeking legislative relief from the mutually exclusive laws.

Schedule of Findings and Questioned Costs

Current Findings – *State Compliance*

#### Finding 12-30 – Failure to Comply with County Cooperative Extension Law

The University did not fully comply with the County Cooperative Extension Law (Law).

During our review of the University's compliance with the Law, we noted that the University has not established a Rural Transition Program to be operated with the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity, as required.

The County Cooperative Extension Law (505 ILCS 45/2b) requires the Cooperative Extension Service of the University of Illinois to establish a Rural Transition Program to be operated in cooperation with the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity to provide assessments, career counseling, on-the-job training, tuition reimbursements, classroom training, financial management training, work experience opportunities, job search skills, job placement, youth programs, and support service to farmers and their families, agriculture-related employees, other rural residents, and small rural businesses who are being forced out of farming or other primary means of employment or whose standard of living or employment has been reduced because of prevailing economic conditions in the agricultural or rural economy.

In discussing these conditions with University officials, they stated the University has not provided the services described in the Law because needed funding from the State Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity has not been received.

Failure to establish a Rural Transition Program results in noncompliance with the Law. (Finding Code 12-30)

#### Recommendation

We recommend the University implement procedures to comply with the requirements of the Law.

#### **University Response:**

Accepted. The University will review this requirement and work through the UI Office of Governmental Relations toward seeking removal of this mandate from the law.

Prior Findings Not Repeated – Federal Compliance

Year ended June 30, 2012

### A. Inadequate Documentation for Payroll and Fringe Benefit Expenditures

The University did not have adequate documentation of payroll and fringe benefit expenditures for employees at the Urbana campus who work on the CES program or the Hatch Grant under the Research and Development Cluster program. (Finding Code 11-04, 10-05, 09-05)

In the current year, similar exceptions were not identified in the sample tested. The University expanded its existing effort reporting process to include the U.S. Department of Agriculture appropriations.

### **B.** Inadequate Documentation for Payroll and Fringe Benefit Expenditures

The University did not have adequate documentation of payroll and fringe benefit expenditures for employees who work on the Research and Development Cluster program and MCH Block Grant. (Finding Code 11-05, 10-04, 09-04)

In the current year, similar exceptions were not identified in the sample tested.

#### C. Inadequate Process for Monitoring SNAP Cost Share

The University did not have an adequate process in place to ensure expenditures used to meet the cost sharing requirement of the SNAP program are allowable. (Finding Code 11-10, 10-09)

Effective October 1, 2010, cost sharing was no longer required for the University's SNAP program.

### D. Inaccurate ARRA 1512 Reports

The University did not accurately report expenditure information in Section 1512 reports submitted for the Research and Development Cluster program. (Finding Code 11-12, 10-16)

In the current year, the University discontinued its practice of reporting ARRA 1512 receipts and expenditures on a one month time lag.

### E. Expenditures Reported in the Incorrect Accounting Period

The University reported expenditures under its Education and Human Resources program in the incorrect accounting period. (Finding Code 11-14, 10-18)

In the current year, similar exceptions were not identified in the sample tested.

### F. Inadequate Documentation to Support Key Personnel

Adequate supporting documentation did not exist to substantiate University personnel worked on the grants for which they were proposed as key personnel for the Research and Development Cluster. (Finding Code 11-16, 10-19)

In the current year, similar exceptions were not identified in the sample tested.

# Prior Findings Not Repeated – Federal Compliance

Year ended June 30, 2012

# G. Failure to Properly Perform Interest Calculations on Federal Advances

The University did not properly calculate interest on federal funds drawn in advance. (Finding Code 11-18, 10-21, 09-17)

In the current year, the University discontinued its practice of requesting advance funding effective July 1, 2012.

# H. Failure to Notify Subrecipients of Federal Funding and Communicate ARRA Information

The University did not provide required program and ARRA information relative to federal funds passed through to the subrecipients of the Research and Development Cluster and Child Care Development Fund Cluster programs for the year ended June 30, 2011. (Finding Code 11-19, 10-22, 09-30)

In the current year, similar exceptions were not identified in the sample tested.

# I. Inadequate Monitoring of Subrecipient OMB A-133 Audit Reports

The University did not adequately perform or document reviews of subrecipient OMB Circular A-133 audit reports. Additionally, the Chicago campus did not have a system to track and follow-up with subrecipients when OMB Circular A-133 reports had not been received (Finding Code 11-20, 10-23, 09-18)

In the current year, similar exceptions were not identified in the sample tested.

# J. Failure to Properly Determine SFA Awards in Accordance with Program Regulations

The University disbursed funds in excess of program award limits at its Chicago campus. (Finding Code 11-23, 10-27)

In the current year, similar exceptions were not identified in the sample tested.

### K. Failure to Properly Complete Required Verification Procedures

The University did not properly perform verification procedures for students at the Chicago campus. (Finding Code 11-24, 10-28, 09-25).

In the current year, similar exceptions were not identified in the sample tested.

# L. Failure to Obtain Written Agreements with Third Party Institutions

The University did not obtain written agreements for all third party institutions as required by federal regulations. (Finding Code 11-26, 10-30, 09-28)

In the current year, similar exceptions were not identified in the sample tested.

# Prior Findings Not Repeated – Federal Compliance

Year ended June 30, 2012

# M. Untimely Submission of Financial Reports

The University does not have a process in place to ensure financial reports are prepared and submitted within required timeframes. (Finding Code 11-27, 10-32)

In the current year, the June 2012 Compliance Supplement does not include suggested audit procedures to test the timely submission of required reports.

# N. Inaccurate Award Records

The University does not have an adequate process to ensure grant award amounts are accurately recorded in the accounting system. (Finding Code 11-31)

In the current year, similar exceptions were not identified in the sample tested.

Prior Findings Not Repeated – State Compliance

Year ended June 30, 2012

# **O.** Failure to Maintain Supporting Documentation for Agency Workforce Report

The University did not accurately complete the Agency Workforce Report and did not maintain adequate supporting documentation for the workforce data included in the report. (Finding Code 11-35, 10-40, 09-44)

In the current year, the University maintained supporting documentation for the workforce data included in the report.

### P. Failure to Comply with Higher Education Veterans Act (Act)

The University did not fully comply with the Higher Education Veterans Service Act by not properly making public campus surveys of the services and programs provided for veterans, active duty military personnel, and their families and not properly submitting the surveys to the Department of Veterans' Affairs, President and Minority Leader of the Senate, the Speaker and Minority Leader of the House of Representatives, and the Governor. (Finding Code 11-37)

In the current year, the University established procedures to ensure the campus surveys were made public and all required submissions were completed.

Notes to Schedule of Expenditures of Federal Awards

## (1) **Basis of Presentation**

The accompanying schedule of expenditures of federal awards includes the federal awards activity of the University of Illinois for the year ended June 30, 2012, and is presented on the accrual basis of accounting. The information in this schedule is presented in accordance with the requirements of OMB Circular A-133, *Audits of States, Local Governments, and Non-Profit Organizations.* Therefore, some amounts presented in this schedule may differ from amounts presented in, or used in the preparation of, the basic financial statements.

The schedule designates federal awards as direct and pass-through. Direct awards represent federal funding awarded directly to the University by a federal funding agency. Pass-through awards are federal awards passed through a non-federal entity.

# (2) Student Loan Programs

As disclosed in the non-cash federal awards sections of the Schedule of Expenditures of Federal Awards, the Federal Direct Student Loans Program (CFDA 84.268) administered by the University awarded approximately \$240.8 million at the Urbana Campus, \$236 million at the Chicago Campus and \$24.1 million at the Springfield Campus.

There were no federal capital contributions received for the year ended June 30, 2012 under the Federal Perkins Loan Program (Perkins), the Health Professions Student Loans Program (HPSL), the Loans to Disadvantaged Students Program (LDS), or the Nursing Student Loans Program (Nursing). The Nurse Faculty Loan Program (NFLP) received \$78,795 in federal capital contributions for the year ended June 30, 2012.

The values of new loans issued to students for the year ended June 30, 2012 were approximately \$5.9 million for Perkins (CFDA 84.038), \$985,009 for HPSL (CFDA 93.342), \$89,661 for NFLP (CFDA 93.264), \$219,211 for Nursing (CFDA 93.364, and \$39,800 for LDS (CFDA 93.342).

The total loan balances outstanding at June 30, 2012 were approximately \$39.4 million for Perkins, \$7.5 million for HPSL, \$431,272 for NFLP, \$672,270 for Nursing, and \$508,883 for LDS.

## (3) Non-cash Federal Assistance

The University of Illinois received a pass-through grant from Illinois Department of Human Services (IDHS) to review the applications of families seeking subsidized day care under the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families, Child Care Development Funds Cluster, and Social Services Block Grant programs. The applications were reviewed according to guidelines set by IDHS, who was the prime recipient of the federal funds. As a result of the University's application review, the State Comptroller distributed \$8,955,607 of federal funds to day care providers as follows:
